Being Kind to Others is Healthy

Have you noticed that it feels good to help others? It's all because of the way our brains are wired - helping others boosts levels of happiness—producing brain chemicals, giving you a rush of emotional feel good called "helper's high". Kindness is a genetic tendency that has been in our brains for thousands of years. It is actually a survival technique- those species that are kind and cooperative with others, tend to survive. This is supported by research that says doing good can have as big an impact on your health as eating healthful foods and exercise. Here are some tips to make that feeling a reality:

- Your brain gives you a bigger emotional reward if you help someone face to face than if you simply

write a check. The good feeling lasts longer if you summarize your helping experience by sharing it or writing it in a journal.

- Start small- help just one person a day for five minutes a day.



With use, any muscle will gain strength. It is the same with goodness- the more good you do, the better you feel, the better you feel, the more good you can do!

Research has shown that people who spend time on others realize they actually feel like they have more time available for themselves.

Peripheral Artery Disease (PAD)

PAD, Peripheral Artery Disease, is a condition that affects 10 million people in the USA. It is caused by vessels that carry blood to the arms and legs become narrowed or clogged. It can cause pain but a person may feel no symptoms at all. Some of the symp-



toms are: leg or hip pain when walking but stops when resting, numbness, tingling or weakness in legs, burning or arching pain in feet or toes, sore on leg that does not heal, cold legs or feet, color change in skin on legs or feet, loss of hair on legs. If you have any of these symptoms, let your physician know.

Pets Help Children's Allergies

Allergies in children seem to be increasing. Reducing exposure to some bacteria may be increasing the incidence of allergies and asthma in children. This "hygiene hypothesis" is based on the idea that an overly clean environment doesn't allow a child's immune system to get the stimulation it needs to mature properly, thus increasing the risk it may turn on itself in the form of allergies. A study published in 2008 in the European Res-

piratory Journal, found that having a dog in the home during infancy was associated with a much lower incidence of developing sensitivities to pollen and inhaled allergens. The researchers suggest that there may be a beneficial effect of early exposure to bacteria that arrive in the house via the pet's fur.



Devoted Teacher: a Blog by Anne Gatts

"We can do this the easy way or the hard way. It's your choice."

My daughter Rachel was describing her interaction with my grandson Isaiah as she was trying to get him dressed.

Like a lot of two and a half year olds he can't be both-
"HE LEADS ME BESIDE STILL WATERS." PSALM 23:2, NRSV ered with things like pants or shoes especially if it means interrupting play-time. She'd given him plenty of warning and when time ran out she gave him a choice. The easy way meant he would cooperatively participate in putting on his clothes. The hard way meant screaming and thrashing around as she navigated his body parts into the proper arm holes and pant legs. After a moment of thoughtful pause he simply said, "The hard way."

That totally cracked me up! The fact that he would choose to exert that much effort to resist the inevitable showed such strong will. But then again, that attitude seemed strangely familiar. Wasn't that what I have been doing for the past year?

About a year and a half ago God called me into new ministry. He asked me to commit to writing and speaking with a very special emphasis in women's ministry. To be honest, that unknown venture was slightly terrifying and yet believing the call was authentic I knew I had to say

yes. I began writing a Christian blog and in February organized a women's conference.

Still my response has been somewhat measured. I knew in my heart God was leading me out of one ministry into another and yet I kept trying to figure out a way that suited me instead of giving up control. And God has been very patient with me. It wasn't until recently I have heard God say, "Anne, we can do this the easy way or the hard way, but ultimately, my will is going to be done." Suddenly I was the two-year old in this story thrashing about instead of choosing obedience.

And so after fifteen years as worship leader I am stepping away from my position. It has been an honor and a privilege to meet with you each week in song and praise, and I will continue to do so from the pew. The funny thing is, after weeks of indecision I no longer feel angst about the future but am resting in peace. I still do not know exactly what the future holds, but I am O.K. with that. I know that God goes before me and will prepare the way. In the interim, I thank-you dear church family for loving and supporting me.

First UMC has recently begun Stephen Ministry, a new and exciting ministry that will allow us to reach out to our congregation and community with one-to-one Christian care. Through Stephen Ministry, a team of First UMC

members, known as Stephen Ministers, will be equipped to provide quality Christian care to individuals facing a variety of personal crises. Some of these situations in which Stephen Ministers may provide care include the birth of a child, a spiritual

crisis, first/last child going to college, hospitalization, unemployment, loneliness, terminal illness, divorce, and the loss of a loved one.

I was privileged to attend a recent Stephen Leader training week. There were 347 individuals from 38 states, 4 provinces in Canada, 3 individuals from China, representing many different church communities BUT with the same heart for loving and caring for others as Jesus.

Stephen Ministers receive 50 hours of training in Chris-

tian caregiving skills, covering topics such as active listening, distinctively Christian care, feelings, confidentiality, and crisis theory.

A major emphasis of Stephen Minister training and supervision is on confidentiality. Stephen Ministry is a very confidential ministry; those receiving care can be sure that their identity and what goes on in the caring relationship will remain private.



Parents must pick-up their children from the classrooms immediately after worship.





Family Pool Party June 21


