Promote Eye Health with Diet

Eat for Eye health! Your first line of defense for maintaining healthy eyes is eating a diet rich in foods that are high in nutrients that nourish the eyes: antioxidant vitamins and minerals; the carotenes lutein, zeaxanthin, and lycopene; and healthy fats. The following foods are top choices for eye health:

- **Blueberries-** Studies show that blueberry extracts help to improve night vision and may be protective against the development of age-related macular degeneration (AMD), glaucoma, and cataracts.
- **Broccoli-** It is a rich source of antioxidant vitamins C and E. It's also rich in lutein, the carotenoid that concentrates in the retina, protecting it from damage and helping to prevent AMD. Broccoli and other members of the cabbage family, such as kale, Brussels sprouts, and collards, are all excellent sources of beta-carotene, lutein, and zeaxanthin.
- **Carrots-** The beta-carotene in carrots provides protection against AMD and the development of cataracts. Carrots also support good night vision.
- **Peppers-** Bell peppers are one of the most nutrient-dense foods available. Studies show that bell peppers protect against cataracts, possibly due to their high vitamin C and beta-carotene content.
- **Spinach-** Spinach is one of the richest dietary sources of lutein, making it important for supporting healthy eyesight and preventing AMD and cataracts.

Health Notes

It is God's nature to bring healing to our brokenness, whether it is emotional, spiritual, or physical.

Older people treated aggressively for hypertension may be at higher risk for injuries from falling. Investigators tracked roughly 5,000 Medicare beneficiaries for three years. These senior citizens had high blood pressure. Most of them were taking medications to control hypertension. Those receiving multiple medications, as so many older people do, were at significantly higher risk for falls leading to hip fractures and head injuries. People who had fallen in the previous year were more than twice as likely to experience another serious injury if they were taking antihypertensive medications. Older persons who experience dizziness, drowsiness or unsteadiness as side effects of their medicine should discuss the benefits

and risks of aggressive blood pressure control with their physicians.

Older persons should receive sufficient vitamin D intake from all sources to lower their risk for falls and fractures, according to a new consensus statement in the *Journal of the American Geriatrics Society*. Dietary sources, sunlight, and supplements can all contribute to vitamin D levels of approximately 30 ng/mL, which appears to protect against fall-related injuries. Previously independent older adults often have to enter long-term care institutions because of repeated falls, and half of all nursing home residents older than 65 years have at least a single fall annually.

Benefits from Regular Exercise

Feeling conflicted by the push-pull of work and family life? New research suggests that regular exercise can help balance out those feelings. Researchers examined the responses of 476 working adults who were surveyed about their exercise behavior

and their confidence in handling work-family conflicts. Those who exercised regularly seemed to experience an increased feeling of competence that carried over into work and home roles, the study authors said.

from our missionaries serving in Indonesia

We are excited to see the youth going on their first overseas mission trip this summer! My (Vicki) first overseas mission trip was also to Belize with my church youth group. It was there that I so clearly remember telling this young girl, same age as me, 16, who was teaching in a very primitive school, that I still had at least 6 years minimum before I could serve the Lord as a missionary teacher. In actuality, although I felt God called me to serve Him on the mission field when I was 10 years old, it was another 21 years before I became a missionary working and living overseas. So, I think it's worth while to say: Don't be alarmed if God's call on your life does not grow to fruition quickly. Follow Him where He leads at all times, and in His time, it most certainly will come to pass!

Here in Indonesia we've been in our rainy

season while you've been in your extended snow season. I have a new theory: Since we are pretty much what would be nearly the opposite side of the earth as where you are and we are, I think your snow keeps seeping through the ground and by the time it gets here, it is rain!!!! And I'd prefer rain for sure! I also clearly recall an Easter at First UMC before we ever left for India when it was cold enough to still have snow on the ground!

We canceled our quest to go on a mission trip to the Philippines over our spring break in March due to the overall costs and lack of funds. It also did not seem to make sense to spend that amount of funds to get there and do something that they can do themselves in regards to physical labor.

Our thoughts are with you as we receive your email prayer requests and see all that is going on in the Sonburst each month.

Spotlight on Vicki

Vicki completed a master's degree in counseling from Georgia State University in 1987 and received a diploma in Christian counseling from The Psychological Studies Institute that same year.

✦ As counselor at Woodstock School in India, Vicki had a sharp learning curve in counseling teens because her prior experience was primarily with adults. It was a very stretching time professionally, since there were no psychologists or psychiatrists available for support and consultation except in Delhi, which was a 9 hour trip away.

✦ In Kenya, Vicki continued as a school counselor and had a Christian counseling center at her fingertips for both support and consultation.

✦ One of Vicki's greatest struggles over the years was arguing with God about being called to work (as a counselor), while desiring to follow her more traditional western, Christian culture which valued stay-at-home moms. And the Lord gave her the 'green light' to (finally) stay at home to serve her family after 4.5 years as school counselor at Rosslyn Academy. She has not gone to work full-time since so she can continue to support and serve her family and utilize her gift of hospitality and encourage others around her, and at times offer counseling to the larger community.

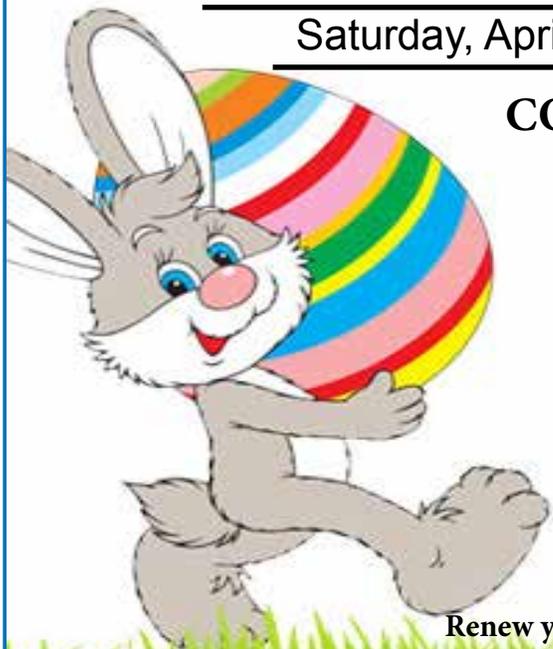
Tomorrow's Promise Preschool

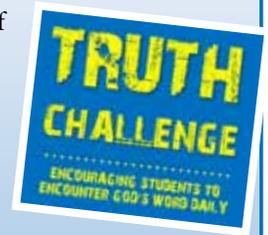

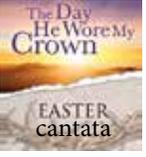

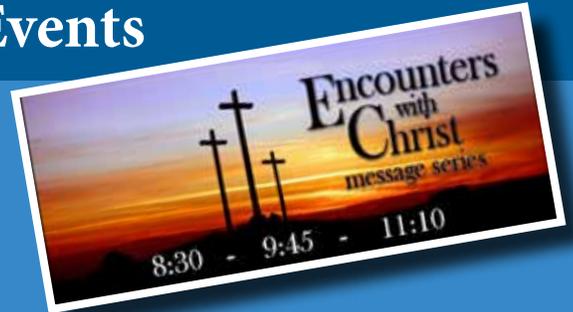
