Sleep Link to Alzheimer

The brain sweeps away waste and toxins during sleep- poor quality sleep is linked to the build-up of toxins that may contribute to Alzheimer’s.

Gambling & Health

New research shows that compulsive gambling is linked to a range of serious health problems including obesity, heart disease, intestinal problems, migraines, fibromyalgia, depression, insomnia, and other stress related disorders. Please seek help- Gamblers Anonymous is a good first step.

Listening to Adolescents

Although the adolescent is navigating many ongoing changes- spirituality and faith are keys to this developmental process. Create a safe time to just talk about their thoughts, beliefs and values. Ask them about their self-worth- where do they find strength, security and support. Ask them if they have a relationship with God- and allow them to share.

This is the season- the season to get outdoors and over work! We are recovering from a very cold, snowy winter and now we are ready to clean up the yard and do some spring cleaning. All of this leads to potential back injuries. According to the National Institute of Neurological Disorders and Stroke, Americans spend at least \$50 billion each year treating low back pain. Back pain is the most common cause of job related disabilities, and it is one of the main reasons people miss work. One factor related to the development of chronic low back pain (back pain lasting more than 3 months) is a lack of strength in the muscles that support the lumbar spine. Your spinal column is the only boney connection you have between your upper and lower body. The vertebrae contain your spinal column along with 31 pairs of spinal nerves that serve as the communication and command system between your body and your brain. Between each

moveable vertebra is a disc whose job is to act like a shock absorber, reducing the impact of stress in the column. Age, trauma, or improper use of the spine can cause the fibrous part of the disc to become weakened. Most problems happen when you use the small back muscles to lift objects from a flexed spine position, instead of keeping the lumbar spine in a neutral position, while squatting and using the larger more powerful muscles of the legs. Proper body mechanics are essential for protection. There are four factors that are essential to spine health: Strength-Stability-Flexibility-Endurance. Because of this, strength training is often prescribed for prevention and treatment of low back pain. This type of training should only be done with a trained professional such as a physical therapist, athletic trainer or exercise physiologist. Check out some of our local professionals.

Missionaries at International House of Prayer (IHOP)

Have you ever had the feeling that you should tell someone about Jesus but for whatever reason talked yourself out of it? The other day I had the opportunity to participate in an outreach centered on sharing the Good News with people (let the reader understand “strangers”) at the Kansas City St. Patrick’s Day parade. Turns out our city has one of the largest St. Patrick’s Day parades in the nation gathering about 100,000 people. The outreach was simple. Pair up and talk to people about Jesus before the parade. My partner and I hopped in the car and took off driving towards downtown, praying the entire way.

When we first arrived, I tried to hit the ground running talking to the first person I saw. It didn’t go so well but at least we had broken the ice, right? As we continued walking around looking for people to talk to I saw a security guard standing at the corner. My initial thought was go talk to her but in my head was a running dialog of all the reasons that was a bad idea... she is busy, she is a security guard she might arrest me, she doesn’t want to hear, she probably already knows all that I have to say... the dialog went on long enough that we passed and I

said nothing. I kept walking but I knew in my heart that I needed to say something but the dialog wouldn’t stop. So I told myself, if she is still there when I get back, I will say something. We continued walking and talked to people for another 30-40 minutes before heading back to the car and subsequently the place she had been standing.

Not surprisingly, she was still there. God had an appointment scheduled and I wasn’t going to miss it even if I was a little late. This time I mustered up the courage to begin to talk about St. Patrick and then Jesus. It turns out that it was one of the better conversations I had that day. She ended up telling me about how she had been thinking about the things we were talking about over the last few weeks and really wanted to have a reason to talk and know more about Jesus. I shared my testimony and walked her through the gospel. It was such a blessing. I am so glad that God didn’t let the dialog in my head stop the truth from going forth. Speaking to strangers about Jesus can be scary but I marvel each time at how God can use me in my weakness to bring a powerful encounter with His great love!

A few key events that stand out in March & April include IHOPKC’s annual St. Patrick’s Day outreach as well the development of a new Roku app to stream the prayer room (“technology speak” that Jason explains below). When we’re not participating in planned outreaches or website development our lives remain quite lively and full of laughter. Isaiah, now 3.5, keeps us young (at least we are telling ourselves that) with his endless energy and constant motion. We are thankful for the spring and the promise of warmer weather which let’s us venture beyond our apartment walls! As the season changes, I am reminded again of our God’s faithfulness. He is the God who, “brings the dead back to life and who creates new things out of nothing.” (Romans 4:17) We stop often to thank our God for all He has done and yet to do! Praising Him now for how He has connected our family to yours.

*Pray for our celebration of Easter! All these years we have lived overseas, Easter seems to be 'lost' in the celebration calendar. The resurrection of Jesus is LIFE! Without His resurrection, there would be no reason to believe in Him for salvation or eternal life because He would not be who He said he was. But in fact, He was victorious over death

and He is who He says He is! Please pray for not only our family to rejoice more heartily in this celebration but for all our students to find it to have meaning in their hearts and lives as well so they can continue to carry the message to the nations and the lost in our own backyards.

Serving Experience in Africa

After serving in India for 4 years, we lived in Mooresville for exactly 5 months before going to work at Rosslyn Academy in Nairobi, Kenya Africa. Rosslyn Academy is a K-12 Christian School in Nairobi. In contrast to India, our windows were open every day of the year in Nairobi where the weather was referred to as, 'eternal spring.' Don served as the Director of Operations and Development and I was the school counselor for 4.5 years out of the 6 years we lived and served there. Nairobi was by far the most dangerous place we've ever lived. The number of car jackings and home robberies were discomfoting and this is by far the thing we miss the least about Nairobi. The crime made it a stressful place to live. The Westgate Mall shootings just a few months ago was a place we also frequented. It broke out hearts to watch that on TV each day. Two Rosslyn parents, both African by birth, were killed at Westgate Mall that day. Tyler graduated from Rosslyn Academy in May 2010.

*Vicki's ministry has been developing more and more into connecting people and needs together; counseling (more informally) a few single gals and supporting a womens' Bible study.

*Vicki is preparing to have surgery to remove at least 1 out of 4 parathyroids in April in the States before she attends Tyler's graduation from Trine University on May 3, 2014.

*Vicki has never found learning a foreign language 'easy!' She studied Spanish twice, and never did really learn it. So the task of learning Bahasa Indonesia is quite the stretching area for her now. Over the 3.5 years here, she has steadily, albeit slowly, improved and is committed to not giving up on learning all she is able while she's in Indonesia!


Women's Scholarship News

Did you ever think of your \$ giving as a barometer of your faith?

St. Paul did. In a thank-you passage to the Philippians (chapter 4), he wrote "It was good of you to share in my troubles... not one church shared with me

in the matter of giving and receiving, except you only... Not that I am looking for a gift, but I am looking for what may be credited to your account... The gifts you sent—they are a fragrant offering, and acceptable sacrifice, pleasing to God."

Last year, among our 580 members, we had 310 "giving units" (counted as couples, families or individuals). Now here is cause for concern: 1/3 of our giv-

ing units contributed \$0 to our church operations. Another 15% gave less than \$25/month.

What might that say about their relationship with our Savior?

Did you ever think of your \$ giving as a barometer of your faith?

Next time you're in church, look around you. Half the people you see could benefit significantly from a prayer of encouragement, a word of Love. Or maybe you are the one whose heart God still yearns to touch.

Paul concluded with this wonderful reminder: "My God will meet all your needs according to His glorious riches in Christ Jesus. To our God and Father be glory for ever and ever. Amen."





Help Support Julie's Trip to Capitol Hill lobbying for brain aneurysm

Julie Workman has taken the challenge to travel to Washington D.C. and lobby on Capitol Hill for brain aneurysm awareness and early detection. This is the third annual lobbying event and takes place on May 6, 2014.

The purpose of their visit to Capitol Hill is to raise awareness about the importance of early detection and the need for greater funding for research in order to save lives.

On May 6th, people will be broken up into small groups of 3-4 to meet with our

state's members of Congress to express to them the importance of this funding for more research.

On May 7th, there is a brief luncheon at which there will be a few presentations by appointed people, including at least one physician. Hopefully many members of Congress or their staff will attend, too.

You can help support Julie as she travels to Capitol Hill. The total cost for travel, food and lodging is approximately \$900.

After my own experience as a brain aneurysm survivor, I can say without a doubt that little is known about this "silent killer" and I am determined to change that. This is the short version of why I must get out to The Brain Aneurysm Foundation's lobby day on Capital hill in May. . .we need to work with Congress to have insurance companies pay for scans to promote early detection when symptoms indicate a possible aneurysm, especially when there is a FAMILY HISTORY, and to work with Congress and the insurance companies to provide greater rehabilitation services. Saving a life is great, but then sending that life home without the proper resources for recovery can be devastating.

Bowling for Brains is the first Annual Fundraising event in the city of Indianapolis to help increase Aneurysm Awareness and raise money for The Brain Aneurysm Foundation. We are also planning on having "extra" activities there for those who can't bowl.


Postal Worker's Food Drive
