Health Notes

“Watch your life and doctrine closely. Persevere in them, because if you do, you will save both yourself and your hearers.” 1 Timothy 4:16

It is that time of the season- time to get your flu shot! This reminder is for pregnant women and pregnant women you may know or have influence. Pregnant women are at increased risk for serious illness from seasonal and pandemic influenza because the immune system changes during pregnancy. These changes appear to place women at increased risk for illness and influenza-related complications. It is therefore critical that women receive influenza vaccination during pregnancy. At this time, approximately 50% of pregnant women are immunized against influenza. “The flu virus is highly infectious and can be particularly dangerous to pregnant women,

as it can cause pneumonia, premature labor, and other complications,” Laura Riley, MD, chair of the College’s Immunization Expert Work Group, which developed the Committee Opinion in conjunction with the College’s Committee on Obstetric Practice, said in an ACOG news release. “Vaccination every year, early in the season and regardless of the stage of pregnancy, is the best line of defense.” The live attenuated vaccine is not recommended for pregnant women. If you know of anyone who is unable to get a flu shot due to the cost- please let me know. Our goal is for everyone to be vaccinated.

Pumpkin Seeds

Will you be scraping out a pumpkin to decorate for Halloween? Don’t throw away those seeds! There is power in them. The seeds are packed with high quality protein with 18 essential amino acids (they are needed for healthy muscle and tissue repair). They have been shown to decrease inflammation in our bodies. Go easy though- 1/4 cup has 169 calories. Roasting them is a better option as this brings down the calorie count to 71 calories.

HPV Vaccination

Do you have any questions about the HPV vaccination? Here are some facts:

- An estimated 20 million persons currently infected with 6.2 million new infections per year.
- In 2013, there were 12,000 new cervical cancer cases and 4,000 deaths.
- HPV is found in 80% of sexually active women age 50 and younger, it is also found in men.
- The vaccination is recommended at ages 11 to 12 in girls and boys because the response is better at this earlier age and vaccination needs to occur before sexual activity.

A gregarious little guy, Titus loves to talk and play with his older sister Arielle and all of the other neighborhood children who flock to the outreach play yard. With his charismatic personality and gift for gab, Titus is surely an evangelist-in-training.

One morning as he mingled with our mission team he showed off his finger with a dangling bandage. He bravely peeled back the adhesive strip to show each person his "owwie" long enough for each one to commiserate with him.

After several people had gotten a good look at his wound he smiled confidently. "That's O.K. because owwies make you stronger."

Suddenly, Holy Spirit whispered to me, "Are you listening? I am speaking."

A truth renewed.

Trials make you stronger.

Pain can be a stimulus for growth.

And when rooted in the Word and will of God, perseverance in trial brings hope.

And perhaps most importantly, as children of God, we are never alone in our sufferings.

Years ago, I endured a season of brokenness. I felt completely worn. As my young daughter lay in the hospital, critically ill with a failing heart I searched the scriptures for a word to sustain me. God did not disappoint. He led me to 2 Corinthians 4:8-9.





Operation Christmas Child

Since 1993, more than 100 million boys and girls in over 130 countries have experienced God's love through the power of simple shoebox gifts from Operation Christmas Child (OCC). Samaritan's Purse works with local churches and ministry partners to deliver the gifts and share the life-changing Good News of Jesus Christ. Last 2 years, our church has donated around 165 boxes – lets shoot for 200 this year!

Packed Shoe Boxes are due by November 17, so please start packing now! There will be boxes available at the Operation Christmas Child (OCC) table in the hall.

Don't want to pack an entire box, but want to participate? There will be a donation box available for you to drop items in. There will be items of the week starting first week of October. Item of the week schedule is as follows:

- 1st week of Oct: School Supplies: Pens, Pencils, sharpeners, crayons, markers, writing pads or paper, picture books, coloring books etc.
- 2nd week of Oct: Toys: dolls, toy trucks, stuffed animals, jump ropes, balls, balloons,
- 3rd week of Oct: Wearable Items: T-shirts, Socks, Hair Ties, Hair Clips, ball caps, sunglasses, toy jewelry, watches, flashlights (with extra batteries)
- 4th week of Oct: Hygiene Items: Toothbrush, mild soap bars (in a Ziploc bag), Combs, Brush, washcloths
- 1st week of Nov: Hard Candies – packaged mints, suckers, gum etc.
- 2nd week of Nov: ANY ITEMS above

Remember! It costs \$7 to ship each box. Include a check, money order or cash in each box (I recommend putting in an envelope and taping to top of inside wrapped box). Donations are always needed for shipping too! There will be a donation box on the OCC table, if you would like to help!





