From the Pastor's Desk

We are going to begin a new sermon series on the book of Acts on August 31. The book of Acts continues the story Luke began in the Gospel according to Luke. It covers the thirty years after Jesus's resurrection and ascension.

In that short time, the church was established and the gospel of salvation was taken throughout the Roman Empire reaching all the way from Jerusalem to Rome. The people preaching the gospel, though ordinary people with human limitations, were empowered by the Holy Spirit to change the world they lived in. The sermon series will wrestle with questions like:

- What kind of power does the Holy Spirit provide today?
- How were the early disciples changed by the Holy Spirit?
- What ministries can our church offer only with the empowerment of the Holy Spirit?



Health Notes

“The eye is the lamp of the body. If your eyes are good, your whole body will be full of light.” Matthew 6:22

Have you experienced blurred vision or dry, itching or burning eyes? You may be experiencing eye strain- most frequently caused by increased use of computer screens. Here are some things you can do to decrease the strain on your eyes:

- Position your screen so outside windows are on the side, not behind or in front of the screen. It is best to decrease the reflection from the screen so it doesn't shine into your eyes.
- Adjust the screens brightness and contrast for your eyes' comfort. You may need to readjust as the surrounding light changes throughout the day.

- Change the color of the screen- green or amber text on a black background is recommended for extended use.
- The screen should be 18-28 inches from your eyes and slightly below eye level.

Your eyes need a short break every 10 to 20 minutes. Take a moment to glance around the room or out the window, focusing on objects at least 20 feet away. Lightly cup your eyes with your palms and relax for a minute. Looking away from the screen, roll your eyes up and down, around and from side to side. Gently massage the bony area around your eyes. Get an annual eye exam!

Calcium Supplements

Calcium supplements have come under scrutiny as research has shown a possible link to cardiovascular disease and an increased risk of kidney stones. Calcium is important; just follow the recommendations of 1000 mg/day for women up to age 50 and men up to age 70 and 1200 mg for anyone older. It is always best to get calcium from food sources. In this case, more isn't better!

More Health News...

Mumps Outbreak

From January to April 18, 2014, 332 people had been reported to have mumps. Ohio State and Fordham University had unusually high number of cases. The outbreaks typically occur in winter and spring. A major contributing factor is being in a crowded environment. Two doses of the MMR are required- it is 88% effective with two doses whereas one dose is 78% effective. Be sure your immunization is up to date.

What Is Radical Hospitality?

What is radical hospitality? It is relating to others the way God relates to us- openly, extravagantly, and constantly welcoming. This hospitality is for everyone- those you like and those you prefer to avoid, those you are familiar with and those who are strangers. The early church is described as people of radical hospitality toward strangers as well as each other. Genesis 18:1-8, Luke 14:7-24, Hebrews 13:1-2, 3 John 1:1-8.



Stephen Ministry

The Importance of Confidentiality

Confidentiality is a cornerstone of Stephen Ministry because it is absolutely essential for building safe, healing, caring relationships.

Stephen Ministers do not reveal what their care receivers have told them. Not to the pastors, not to the Stephen Leaders, not to their spouses or friends, and not to other Stephen Ministers.

Trust is vital for a caring relationship to be effective. Care receivers are experiencing difficulties that leave them feeling very vulnerable. Discussing their innermost feelings is an important step toward healing. BUT in order to open up and discuss that which is troubling them most, care receivers need complete trust in their Stephen Minister – AND the assurance that what they say will not be circulated to others ever!

This means that nobody, except the Stephen Minister, the care receiver and the Stephen Leader who matched the two together, even knows that a person has a Stephen Minister. Of course, care receivers are free to tell others about the relationship and who their Stephen Minister is, BUT the Stephen Minister never shares that information.

Stephen Ministry is a high-quality caregiving ministry that you can count on should you ever have the need. Confidentiality is a cornerstone of good ministry – and of Stephen Ministry.

Do You Know Your Purpose?

One of the most amazing characteristics of the early church found in the book of Acts is the incredible multiplication that happened daily! In Acts 2:47, it says that “the Lord added to their number daily those who were being saved.” (GW) These were new converts, not transfers from another church! The early church was exploding with exponential growth! What’s the secret?

I believe the early church as seen in Acts has a characteristic that many of our churches today are lacking: A unified purpose. Knowing our purpose is necessary. Acts 2:46 says,

“The believers had a single purpose and went to the temple everyday....”

Do you know your purpose? Do we as a church know our purpose? In Matthew 28:19-20, Jesus told his disciples to “go and make disciples of all nations.” We as the church, the body of Christ are called to reach people for Jesus. Each individual person and ministry within our church should know and understand their role and purpose in accomplishing the mission of making disciples!


Thanks from Carnival Worker’s Ministry

Immersed in the task of scraping filth from the kitchen floor, an audience of two suddenly appeared. As I looked up, two pairs of inquiring eyes peered in from the open door- Pooh Man and Baby J.

It was Englewood and here in the 'hood nobody used their given names. The two brothers lived downstairs from the apartment we were cleaning and painting for the Chicago Urban Youth Ministry. They had heard the racket we were causing and had come upstairs to investigate.

After inviting them in, I learned that Pooh Man was ten and brother Baby J was six. They were very curious about what I was doing on the kitchen floor with a putty knife. After explaining that I was scraping up the grease and dirt left behind so somebody else could move in they were eager to help me. We became fast friends in the fight against grime.

I showed Baby J how to position the scraper against the floor and with my

hand over his we applied steady pressure to plow up the layers of grease. Each time we managed to move some of the sludge I would say, "That's so disgusting!" Baby J would gleefully echo, "Disgusting!" in the way that all little boys do when they revel in getting dirty.

As we worked, we played games and told riddles. Practiced spelling words and addition facts. Every answer, correct or incorrect, received praise and encouragement. That morning I knew I was there to work on the apartment, but recognized that my divine assignment was to lavish love and encouragement on those two beautiful little boys.

As our rapport grew, Pooh Man told me about his family. One of his brothers had passed as a result of the violence in the neighborhood. Another was in jail. He spoke about it without emotion as if it was another ordinary fact of life.

The following day we returned to the apartment to bless it. Pooh Man and Baby

J tore up the stairs to join our prayer circle. As we held hands and prayed aloud the Spirit of God descended upon us like a cloud. When I opened my eyes, Pooh Man's tear-filled eyes were locked onto mine.

And I can't get them out of my mind.

That little one, hair full of dreads, pants hung low, will never know how deep a place has been burrowed into my heart for him.

But God knows.

So I will continue to lift up prayers of intercession that the God of this city will rescue him.

And I am confident.

Confident that God who loves this child and every other child with an all-consuming love will hear my cries and answer.

50 Years Ago at Mooresville First UMC

Fifty years ago this church agreed to let Alcoholics Anonymous meet. Thank you to those in our past as well as those today, who have continued to support and encourage this arm of our church.

We now have three meetings that gather every week. They are well attended with an approximate total of 75 people coming. But 75 people are just the members of AA. Their families are also being given the chance to recover when they attend the Alanon meeting. In fact, when the first few meetings of AA were held at the old church on Harrison St., it was the wife of an alcoholic that kept the money for the offering taken that night. Why? None of the alcoholics were trusted with it, because none of them had been sober more than 30 days. That is different now. We have members that have celebrated periods of 20, 30, and over 40 years of continuous sobriety. Praise the Lord and His Holy Spirit for it!

As Paul wrote, he was given a thorn in his flesh, a messenger of Satan to torment him. Three times I pleaded with the Lord to take

my addiction away. But he said to me, "My grace is sufficient for you, for my power is made perfect in weakness." His grace is being poured out in those meetings "sometimes quickly, sometimes slowly," but as the AA Big Book promises, we will know a new freedom and a new happiness if we work for them.

You have given us a place to meet and it has given this alcoholic more than anything he could have wished for on that first day when I walked through the doors. Not just a new freedom and a new happiness, but a life that I had never known before. Thank you.

If you or your family are struggling with alcohol or addiction feel free to come in to one of the groups or call the office and ask them to have a person to call you. It is by carrying the message that the Founder of AA told us we will stay sober as we help one another - each alcoholic - one day at a time.
