The Focus on Prayer Praying Like Jesus

"For this reason I am telling you, whatever things you ask for in prayer in accordance with God's will, believe with confident trust that you have received them, and they will be given to you." Mark 11:24

We often read biographies of people to learn about their lives. When we read about the life of Jesus in the gospels, we learn one of His great secrets. Jesus showed us by example the importance of prayer. If He prayed, we need to pray. If He needed time alone with God, we do also.

Jesus believed that prayer works. He knew the power of prayer and its effectiveness. He had an intimate relationship with God, the Father and from His example we can develop the desire to spend time with the Father. We need to believe in prayer.

Many times we do not pray because we doubt that our prayers will make any difference. Satan chides us in to believing that prayer does not work. Too often we miss the main reason for prayer, which is conversation, dialogue, and building and maintaining a relationship with our heavenly Father.

In addition to building and maintaining a relationship with our heavenly Father, making requests is a needed aspect of prayer. If we consider the prayers of Jesus, we cannot ignore or take lightly the boldness and confidence with which He spoke about prayer and with which He prayed.



Jesus taught that prayer works and encouraged us to pray because God, like an earthly father, is overjoyed to meet the needs and fill the requests of a loving and obedient child. Positive answers to our prayers come when we pray for God's kingdom to expand, His will to be done, and His Name to be glorified.

We can have the same confidence that Jesus had in knowing that God answers prayer.


