"The Long View"

I was talking with a worshipper one Sunday before the service began and asked why he always sat on the very last pew. His answer was clever yet metaphorical. He said, as he held out his hand and moved it with a sweeping motion toward the chancel area, "I like the lo-o-o-ong view!" This man has lived long enough to have "the long view" perspective.

Every church must have a person or persons who help the Body keep an eye on the long view. Long view thinking asks questions like: "What is it that God is asking us to do in the next five, ten, fifteen years?," "What must we be doing now in terms of resources (funding, facilities, staffing, programming, lay leadership development) to put ourselves in the very best position to achieve the vision?," "How do we articulate the vision in a way that it can be embraced by the Body - the congregation?"

In a world where time seems to be at a premium - where everything of value must be accomplished in seconds, minutes, hours and days - not months and years - we find ourselves, too often, scrambling to satisfy the insatiable hunger of the immediate schedule. The long view can get lost in the scramble.

I covet the days where the only agenda is to simply reflect on where God has brought me, to give thanks and then to thank God for where God will lead me.

The long view requires patience, faithfulness, persistence, gentleness, a love of God and the Church with which God has blessed us. Will you join me in taking the long view of ministry and mission in this place?





Thousands served

Each Thursday night dozens of faithful volunteers serve the community by offering a free meal to anyone who comes to the Welcome Table.

This ministry is now in its third year and continues to grow at a fast pace. In 2012 an average of 175 meals were served each Thursday here at 1st UMC (not including take out meals). Combine those numbers with Tuesday meals at New Providence Presbyterian Church and the number climbs to 20,790 for the year.

The largest turnout of the Welcome Table at 1st UMC this year was 288. Chef Amelia Geis said there were about 30 takeout orders that night as well, pushing it over the 300 mark.

Another part of the Welcome Table ministry is the transportation provided from Broadway Towers and Parkside. Currently there is a need for drivers on the 4th Thursdays of each month. Servers and cleanup volunteers are also needed to keep this ministry going.


Christmas CDs here!

As the new year gets underway so does another year of men's fellowship with the Men's Connection. This group meets monthly for good food, fellowship and sharing.


