**Henry Center**



I have been tasked with taking over the oversight of the Henry Center as we move forward with the different staff changes that are happening. The first thing I wanted to do was to go down to the Henry Center and see how it all operates. I had been down before to say hello and keep up the good work, but was unfamiliar with the details of how it was all done. I asked questions and wanted honest feedback about how we could improve the ministry. Here is what I found:

**"We need more help!"**

We have a great group of people who volunteer regularly, but we don't have a deep roster of people. So if someone is sick or can't make it, it puts a huge strain on those who are left. The Henry Center is open from 12-2 p.m. on Tuesdays and Thursdays, but those volunteers come in early, around 10:30 a.m. and stay late, sometimes until 4 p.m. Wow! That's almost a part time job! But what if we had a volunteer who just came in early and did prep? Then they could go home and another volunteer could distribute what had been prepped during open hours. If you are available, even for a single hour each week, that would make a huge difference in the life of the Henry Center Ministry.

**"The Community needs this."**

As the volunteers meet with people or families, you can see the real need that so many people have. We give a relatively small amount of assistance to people, but it makes a big difference to them. Matthew 25:35 says, "I was hungry and you gave me something to eat." Is Jesus talking specifically about food? Well yes and no. He is talking about literally feeding someone, but he is speaking in general about the need to help our fellow man. We serve our community because they need it, but we also serve them because Jesus commands it. The passage goes on to describe who knows God and who doesn't. Those who know God are the ones who serve others. The other people didn't recognize those who are in need.

I remember last year for stewardship we interviewed Charlie Bair for a video. I remember him saying, "You'd think serving would be about giving something to someone else, but really, you end up receiving so much more."

My prayer for you and our Henry Center is that we could make it a place where people give and receive the rich blessings that God has for us. Please consider becoming part of this ministry. If you can't serve during the day, we are working on solutions for that. If you want to get involved, we will make it happen.
