**The Message—Pastor Rickey Wade**

**Prevenient Grace**

In the third chapter of Genesis we find the story of sin. The humans God made did the very thing God told them not to do; they ate from the tree of knowledge of good and evil. After their sin they realized that they were naked so they hid themselves. Most of us realize that we cannot hide from God, but we try all the same. Adam and Eve hid from God.

As Adam and Eve hide from God, we get our first glimpse of God’s Prevenient Grace. Also, in the third chapter of Genesis we find these words, “And they heard the sound of the LORD God walking in the garden in the cool of the day, and the man and his wife hid themselves from the presence of the LORD God among the trees of the garden. Then the LORD God called to the man, and said to him, ‘Where are you?’” (vv. 8-9). “Where are you?” God knew where they were; God did not need to ask. Therefore, the question was not meant to provide information to God; the question was meant to provide information to us. We are to realize that God is a searching God, a looking God, and a longing God. God longs to have a relationship with us and as such comes looking for us. God comes looking for us even when we sin and try to hide.

We may often say, or hear others say, “I have found the Lord!” The truth is the Lord finds us; we simply realize that we have been found. In the Gospel of Saint John, we hear Philip tell Nathanael, “We have found the Lord.” However, Nathanael (and the others) soon realize otherwise when Jesus says he saw Nathanael, “Before Philip called you, when you were under the fig tree, I saw you” (v. 1:48). Before Nathanael was looking for Jesus, Jesus was looking for Nathanael. Before any one of us ever imagined to look for God, God was looking for us – this is Prevenient Grace. This action of God is beyond our control. We may choose to ignore God, abandon God, or even disown God, but we cannot stop God from loving us and looking for us.

When God looks for us the Spirit stirs in our soul. People have often referred to this stirring as conviction. In other words, we could feel God moving in our life, and there was nothing we could do about it. Some people answer the call of conviction and surrender to God, others resist. The Prodigal Son is a wonderful story of conviction, surrender, and resistance. However, one thing I would like to point out. Read the story, and take note, the Father sees his son coming from a distance, why? Because the Father was looking for his child! Have you yet realized that our Heavenly Father is looking for you – I can assure you that he is!
