

## The Message—Pastor Rickey Wade

### Something Missing

My grandmother lived, from my earliest recollection, in an old farmhouse. It was typical to this area a hundred years ago. It was an “A” frame structure with two rooms downstairs and two rooms upstairs. One chimney was used to heat the whole house, and the kitchen looked like an add-on to the back, while the front porch was made from sawmill planks. The home was without indoor plumbing except for a faucet; one for cold water, one for hot. Her lighting came from a solitary bulb in a porcelain fixture mounted on the ceiling. My grandmother’s beds were feather beds covered with hand-stitched quilts. Life for this lady born at the turn of the twentieth century was one of few things and much work.

In the summer I would spend a week or two with grandmamma, help her in the garden, cut the grass, cleanup around the place, and things like that. In the evening, before supper, I would take a bath in the creek behind the barn. The only caution about taking a bath in the creek was to make sure the cows were downstream rather than upstream, if you know what I mean. Supper was normally something fried. Today, we are told that stuff will kill you, and eventually it probably will. It finally got grandmamma after eighty-something years!

After supper, about dusk, we would sit on the porch and listen to the creek, the song birds getting ready for roost, and a faithful old owl that nested just up the hollow. Grandmamma would brush out her hair that came below her waist and was still coal black at close to eighty, and we would talk. We talked because she did not own a T.V. One evening I asked her if she missed not having a T.V. She said, “No child, you don’t miss what you never had.” I had to think on that for a while.

I have come to the conclusion that grandmamma was mostly right. A person may not miss what he never had. On the other hand, a person can long for that which he never had. For example, a person who has never known Christ can, in fact, have a deep longing for Christ. That person may not know the source of the longing, or the exact nature of the longing, but it is real just the same. Saint Augustine once said, “Our hearts are restless until they rest in Thee. . .” In other words, each of us has a God-size hole in our life. Many try to fill that hole with things, pleasures, addictions, and even activity. However, the only thing that completely and neatly fits in that hole is God. Until we match God with the hole in our life there is always the sense that something is missing.

Maybe this something missing is why Jesus says, “Come to Me, all who are weary and heavy-laden, and I will give you rest. Take My yoke upon you, and learn from Me, for I am gentle and humble in heart; and you shall find rest for your souls. For My yoke is easy, and My load is light” (St. Matthew 11:28-30). I believe God is calling the Church to help all those who have tried to fill their lives with things, pleasures, or addictions. The question for me, and for you, is where is God calling me to serve? How can I be the hands and feet of Jesus to lighten the loads of others and allow God to fill that hole in their life. And, to be sure, as we share our faith and ability with others, God fills in our hole as well.
