#### FINANCIAL YEAR ENDS WELL!

Thanks to everyone who made it a priority to support the ministry of God through our church at the end of the year. We had a great December and ended the year in great shape.

In the ministry fund at the end of December, we had finished 100% of our ministry year, and we had received 98% of our Ministry Fund Budget \$1,648,830. for the year. One-twelfth of our Ministry Fund budget for the year is \$137,402; our receipts in December totaled \$226,374. Our ministry expenses for the month were \$176,778.18. Our YTD expenses were \$1,603,626. We ended the year with a surplus of \$9,261; combined with our beginning balance from January 1, 2009, we will begin 2010 with \$89,875. These reserve funds keep us afloat during the summer when contributions are generally lean. It is good to start the year this way! Our Conference apportionments were paid 100% in 2009. This supports our extended United Methodist ministries, missions and institutions.

In the Holy Ground Fund, we received \$65,420 in December. Since the first of the year, we have received \$398,541. Our current indebtedness is \$912,666. Our total pledges for the campaign were \$1,595,405. Since May 2008 we have received \$836,526 (53%). That leaves us \$758,878 to complete our Holy Ground Campaign by May of 2011.

# Shepherd's Staff: Looking Backwards and Forwards

January is named for the Roman god Janus, who had two faces—one looking back into the past, and one looking forward info the future. That is

always the stance I seem to take in January. I want to reflect on the year past and learn from it, but I also want to look ahead and have some positive, pro-active directions for the new year.

As I look back on 2009, it was a good year in many respects, but it was also a tough year. The economy seemed to overshadow everything. But I am very pleased that we ended the year in such good shape. Though our contributions to the ministry fund were \$84,000 under 2008 and \$36,000 under our 2009 budget, they were \$9,000 over our expenses. I have to commend our staff for tightening their belts and holding expenses to a minimum, and I appreciate our members for accommodating to the changes that entailed. The great news is, our ministry did not suffer. We retained almost all our staff, and our programs carried on in an effective way. We were still touching lives for Jesus, and that's what matters. We will also begin the year with an even bigger reserve fund than we had last year due to the combination of steady support from church members and our frugal spending.

In the people numbers, we are good on two out of three. Our membership grew from 2,196 to 2,237, and we received 98 new members during the year. Our professions of faith (people making a first commitment) were also strong; we had 34. Unfortunately, our worship attendance took an overall dip in 2009, from 857 to 805. Though still strong and over the 800 mark, we don't want to continue this trend. Decreases in worship attendance are being reported in most mainline churches, of which the United Methodist Church is one. but I am not satisfied to go with the flow! It seems to be a combination of factors: the aging of our congregation, the continual encroachment of family, school, and recreational activities into the Sunday morning schedule, and perhaps some after-effects of transitions in leadership.

However, as I look back on 2009, I am not disappointed; in fact, I am encouraged. Our children's and youth ministries are going full steam. Our adult discipleship ministries are bursting at the seams. We are engaged in mission in our community and around the world through the United Methodist Church. And I feel a

great positive energy about our church. I see people every week whose lives are being touched by our ministry, folks who are growing deeper in their faith by what we are doing. Guests in our worship tell me that they feel our church is alive and friendly when they visit. Those kinds of things don't show up on statistical reports, but they are very real and important.

As I look ahead into the new year, I see several areas of emphasis:

- Our three-year strategic plan will end in May.
   We will need to update, revise, and strengthen our strategic ministry directions for the next few years.
- We will emphasize becoming an invitational congregation. We are already pretty friendly, but to become a growing church and to offset losses in worship attendance, we need to do evangelism/hospitality on a more widespread basis.
- We will continue to educate the congregation about good stewardship, not only about finances, but about all the ways God calls us to be stewards. Stewardship is a mindset that, once it takes hold in a church, can make a powerful difference.

I am thankful for the support of the congregation as we do ministry. It is through your giving, teaching, serving, and attending that we are the community of faith that we are. I am also hopeful that our best days are yet ahead of us, so as Paul said, "forgetting what lies behind and straining forward to what lies ahead, [let us] press on toward the goal for the prize of the heavenly call of God in Christ Jesus." (Philippians 3:14)
