

Easter & Holy Week

As we walk through this season of Lent, we are reminded of the reason for struggle and sacrifice that will come on Easter Sunday. Holy Week begins with Palm Sunday on Sunday, March 20 with a children's Palm Parade in all three services. A service for Maundy Thursday will be on Thursday, March 24 at 6:30 p.m. in the sanctuary, and a Good Friday service will



be on Friday, March 25 at 6:30 p.m. in the sanctuary. We will begin Easter on Sunday, March 27 with a Sunrise Service on Arlington Lawn in Downtown Hot Springs at 6:30 a.m. Easter Traditional services will be held in the sanctuary at 8:15 a.m. and 10:45 a.m., and The ConneXion service will be at 9:30 a.m. in the Christian Life Center.

Our Church will take the special Easter offering at each service on Easter Sunday. The offering is a vital part of our outreach missions and will be distributed to local ministries and international missions to help them continue their great work. The local ministries are The Caring Place; Cooperative Christian Ministry and Clinic (CCMC); Project Hope Food Bank; Samaritan Ministries; Garland Co. CASA; Garland Co. Habitat for Humanity; the Oaklawn Racetrack Chaplaincy; Our Promise Cancer Resources; and Safe Haven Shelter for Women and Children. We will also support our Open Arms Food Pantry with the offering. The international missions are the United Methodist Board of Global Missions project for missionaries around the world; Darrow Frazier, missionary with Cadence International ministry to U.S. military communities; and the FUMC Rio Bravo mission team.

Resurrection Rolls

- 1 package frozen rolls, thawed
- 1 bag large marshmallows
- 1/4 cup melted butter or margarine
- 6 tablespoons sugar
- 1 teaspoon cinnamon

Press the rolls into flat circles. Place a marshmallow in the center of each roll and pinch the dough around it. Roll the marshmallow-filled rolls into round balls. Brush each ball with butter and


sprinkle it with sugar and cinnamon. Let the rolls rise for 30 to 45 minutes. Bake them at 350 degrees for 15 minutes or until golden brown. Cut open. Just like the tomb on Easter Sunday, these buns are empty!



Created by GOD: Human Sexuality Class For All 5th & 6th Graders The materials are presented to children in 5th-6th grades using a seminar format. Created by God teaches: I am uniquely created as God meant me to be; I am a good creation; God expects me to make responsible choices for myself, including those having to do with sexuality; How male and female bodies change during puberty and how reproduction occurs







Hymnody 101 Methodists have long been known as "a singing people", and I believe that description remains appropriate to this day. Charles Wesley was one of the most prolific hymn writers ever. John Wesley also composed and translated hymns. In America, hymn-singing was an important part of the tradition of camp meetings, religious worship, and revival services common throughout the nineteenth and early twentieth centuries. The current United Methodist Hymnal is one of the most successful hymnals ever published.

While certainly not all of we Methodists can sing or like singing, the denomination as a whole was and is a tuneful one. We don't always agree on the hymns we sing and some of them may not be as familiar to us as others. However, when we only sing hymns that are familiar to us, or that we like the most, during a worship service, we may deprive ourselves of a deeper worship experience. This is a primary reason for the annual publication of The United Methodist Music and Worship Planner. This publication assists worship planners in picking scriptures, hymns, anthems and other elements that follow the liturgical calendar. Another great source for worship planning is the website www.hymnary.org. I invite you to check out this site. It includes hymns from every mainline denomination and gives historical background on each hymn. It also includes many recordings of hymns. A feature that is especially helpful for worship planning is the tab that allows one to pick a scripture passage. When the passage is chosen, immediately an entire list of hymns appropriate to the scripture is opened. This feature is especially helpful when the normal lectionary is not being used. Weaving the hymns into the fabric of the scriptures and sermon for the day will lead to a more substantive and fulfilling worship experience.
