"BELIEVE"

I heard someone say something on the radio recently about the relationship between belief and behavior that I am still thinking about. They said that for the person who is not a follower of Jesus Christ, their behavior shapes their beliefs. This person does things that they know they probably shouldn't be doing, but as those behaviors become a habit, they come to believe that what they are doing is okay.

On the other hand, for the Christ-follower, our core beliefs shape our behavior. We begin with what we believe about God, the world, and ourselves, and our behavior grows out of those beliefs. Even when we do something we know isn't right, we realize deep down inside that we are going against our belief system.

As I said, I'm still thinking about this. In some ways it sounds too simplistic, but it does ring true in my experience. I know that if I do something that's not really good for me, I can convince myself that it's all right. But if I start with what I believe to be true, I will know that the negative behavior is something I really shouldn't be doing and it helps me avoid it.

All this is to say that it is very important that we examine our core beliefs as Christians so that we know what we believe and why we believe it, and how it shapes our character and actions. If this sounds like something you would like to do, please join us this fall on Wednesday evenings at 6:30 p.m. at the church for the new study, "Believe." We will look at what Christians believe and how those beliefs can draw us closer to Christ. Please see the article in this issue of the *Informer* for more information about the class.




