Associate Pastor's Column

Hopefully by now you've heard that not only did we meet our financial goal through the Lenten season, but we beat it – raising \$14,136 for Engineers in Action of Bolivia. We are now providing the funding to hire an engineer to live in an area and train the local villagers on how to run, operate, and maintain the water wells that are already in place. This will give the people there the tools that are necessary to make sure that they have water for their community as well as their families. There is no way to measure the full impact that will have. But we can rest assured that many lives will be saved and changed as a result. I'd like to say again, "Thank You!" to all of those who attended the special Lenten services and contributed to the special Least of These offering. Our combined gifts have made a tremendous difference.

On the heels of that, as well as the incredible Easter Sunday that was celebrated here, we are ready to begin our next chapter of God-Sized service. Our Weekend of Serving is upon us. Six years ago this church family began the tradition of ending our confirmation class with a Day of Serving. It started out with our confirmation class members, their families, and their friends in faith working on projects in the community. That caught on very quickly and other people in our church wanted in. It has now grown to the point that it can no longer be contained and confined to simply one day. It is now an entire weekend of service related projects carried out by this church family. There are so many ways to get involved and to serve. We have before us the opportunity to "Be The Body." Please see the other article in this newsletter for more information and a few more specifics.

In the message that I preached this past Sunday, we looked at the Apostle Paul's words in 1 Corinthians 12 and I talked about how it takes all of us working together in order for the Body to move forward. We have been given the privilege of being vessels of Christ's love and His message of service to friends and neighbors. We are the plan. There isn't a back-up. If Christ's love is to be known and if it is to be real in our world; then it us up to us, as His followers, to show that in tangible and authentic ways. We need to be willing to do whatever it takes to make sure that people get and understand that we love them, regardless of their station in life and what is going on around them. According to Paul, we have an obligation to show special attention and give special honor to the people who lack those things in our world. We need to remember that when one part of us suffers, we all suffer and that the church needs to be the place where everyone finds equal concern and care. I also shared that our church's Weekend of Serving is one of the registered projects for the Rethink Church movement and the Change the World effort of the United Methodist Church. The final loose end I have to tie up is about my upcoming ordination. After nearly 15 years of working towards the goal, I will be ordained as an elder in the United Methodist Church at this year's Annual Conference. The ordination service takes place at Boston Avenue UMC in Tulsa at 7pm on Tuesday, June 1st. This church has played such a vital role in this journey for me and my family and we Thank You from the bottom of our hearts. Everyone who can attend the service is cordially invited to come. HAITI MISSION TRIP REQUEST

Dear Church Family,

On May 3, 2010, I will be travelling with a group of Pastors from the Greater Kansas City Area, to Port-au-Prince Haiti. This will be my second opportunity to provide assistance to a mission effort in this poverty stricken country. This time the challenge will be greater, as the area is still trying to recover from the devastation of a massive earthquake that occurred in January of this year.

My mother, Pastor Karen Yount, has been working with and advocating Haiti for the past 13 years and will be leading our group on this mission. She has asked that I go with them to provide logistical support and to document the trip for Global Ministries.


The focus of this mission is for the Pastors of our group to meet with and counsel the Pastors of the Port-au-Prince area Protestant Churches. As you can imagine the toll on their spiritual well being has been as devastating as the earthquake itself. Many of the Haitian Pastor's my mother has worked with over the years have requested that she come so they can speak with her. She tried to go in February, but was not permitted to at that time.

At the request of the Director of CONASPEH (The National Spiritual Council of Churches of Haiti), Patrick Villier, we have collected a large amount of School Supplies. The School that was built by Global Ministries was totally destroyed and along with it all of their supplies. They have cleared the building from the property and are holding classes again in three large tents. Larkin Bailey Elementary held a drive for school supplies and gathered sixteen boxes which will sent in a shipping container with other donated supplies from the Kansas City area ahead of us.

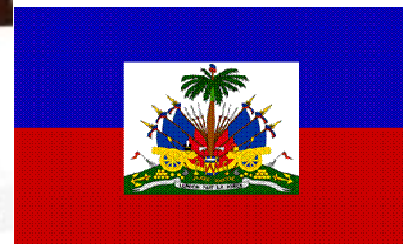
I would like to ask if our Church can sponsor me on this mission to help offset some of the expenses I will incur. The total cost per person on this trip will be approximately \$1500. If we have any moneys left at the end we will purchase items for the school in Haiti. We will purchase things such as gasoline for the generator and drinking water for the facility.

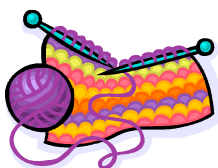

Students develop wide knowledge and skill in areas such as purchasing practices, serving etiquette, table setup, meat identification and fabrication, customer service, dining room management, quantity food preparation, preparing gourmet breads, desserts and entrées. The average annual salary for entry-level assistant chefs is approximately \$35,000. Executive chefs earn annual salaries between \$60,000 and \$140,000 depending on location and ability. With paid internships as part of the program curriculum, students can begin earning even before graduation! With 100% job placement among graduates who earn an Associate in Applied Science degree in Culinary Arts from OSU Institute of Technology, graduates can work with hotel chains, vacation resorts, cruise ships, country clubs, hospitals, schools, corporate cafeterias and conferences.

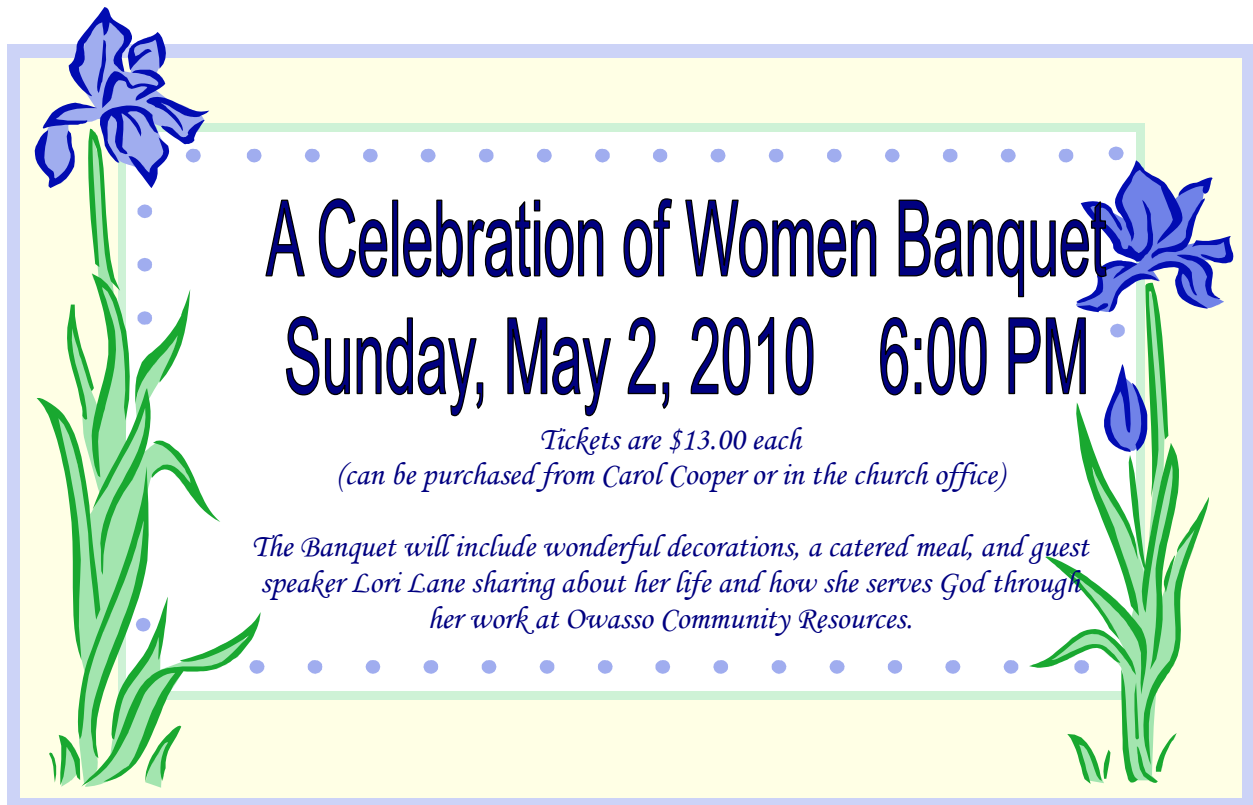
