OPERATION CHRISTMAS CHILD

Our mission is to make disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world. And our goal is to serve those outside our church as much as we serve those members in our church. These two can be met together in the next few weeks. The church council is challenging us to be part of Samaritan's Purse Operation Christmas Child. This was started by Franklin Graham. You may have heard it called the Shoebox Ministry. It is simple to do.

First, get a shoebox furnished by the Missions Committee. Second, fill it with small gifts for a boy or girl. Third, bring it back to the church with \$9 shipping fee by November 11th. Then we will take them to Lubbock where Samaritan's Purse will add a pamphlet introducing Jesus and His love. They then hire a large plane to deliver the shoeboxes overseas.

Operation Christmas Child is in its 25th year. In 2012 they delivered over 100 million shoeboxes. Each box is an opportunity for a boy or girl to experience the love of God in a tangible way and hear the Gospel. Many of them then participate in the follow-up program, The Greatest Journey, which teaches them how to faithfully follow Christ and share Him with others. We would like to send at least 50 boxes from our church. Will you prayerfully consider joining us in this exciting ministry?
