ove is not simple. It is a simple concept, but the launching of love ■into our lives and the lives of others is as complex as the launching of a rocket into space. It can take a great deal of preparation and planning. Sometimes we can fire off a spontaneous act of love and caring, but really sustaining a steadfast love for one another is complicated. In 2017, we will launch Vision 2020 (see detailed article on page 6 of this Steeple issue). This vision includes a series of goals, one for each year. In 2017, we hope to help all of our church members face whatever challenges arise, whether physical or spiritual. This is no small task of love. It will involve a great deal of planning and work. In some ways, the commitment to really help one another should be simple, but it isn't.

■ ow do we respond to needs? How will we handle large financial needs? How will we handle situations when the need requested may not be the best way to help someone's overall situation? It is going to get messy. It is going to challenge our patience and our generosity. It is a major operation of love. And love is not simple.

ray for God to guide us in love. Pray for God to lead you in love.

Healthy Grieving

If you are grieving the loss of a friend or family member, you are facing



many deep emotions. It may be difficult to untangle them all. Here are some basic suggestions to face grief from a healthy outlook. Understand that each circumstance is different, and each person will approach grief from a unique and personal perspective. Even with this in mind, we think you will find these suggestions helpful.

- · Acknowledge and understand your own grief.
- Allow your grief to be recognized by others.
- Feel free to grieve in your own unique way.
- Tell your story to others (the honest account of your loss).
- Learn life's lessons through your loss (becoming more humane, compassionate).
- Commit to the journey, long or short, that leads back to the point where you can live with optimism and hope.
- Share the comfort you have received with others in need

Trust God and cling to Him. Bring all of your questions and feelings honestly to Him. Grief recovery is not simply feeling better. It is the ability to find joy in life again. It is to treasure the memory of loved ones, to miss them, and to live better because of the time in your life that you spent with them. Grief is not an enemy or a sign of weakness. It is a sign of being human. It is the cost of loving someone. It is inevitable that during such a loss we would be deeply impacted, shocked, or wounded by it. Grief is the manner

or process in which we work through this loss. There is a goal in the grieving process. The emotions are seeking to reorganize themselves to cope with the loss and to establish healthy relationships once again.

Adult Discipleship

Thoughtful Christian Gathering (Sundays, 9:15 am, Room 200)

• February 5, 12: Great Themes of the Bible, led by Roger Doll and Danny Halel

This study suggests there are major themes in the Bible which tell us about God and God's role in our lives. Week one's focus will be that God loves us and at the center of the creation is a heart of compassion. The second week will be that our minds are repeatedly too small to fathom the enormity of God's mind and heart. Each session will use Old and New Testament texts and stories.

· February 19 and 26: Abraham, led by Rick Hargrove

Three religious traditions look to Abraham as the "father of faith" in one sense or another: Judaism, Christianity, and Islam. In the New Testament, both James and Paul consider Abraham an important model to Christianity. Since Abraham is such an important figure, this class will examine more closely Abraham as a model of faith. This two-week study will review what is known about Abraham from the Bible and examine the relationship Abraham had with God. Participants will also receive some clues about how that relationship can inform their lives of faith today.



As our first, very successful, three-year Vision drew to a close, many of our Elders, Deacons, Trustees, staff, and lay persons, attended the August 2016 FUPC Visioning Summit. Our purpose was to discern what God revealed to us during that three-year period and to try to understand what He wants us to do next. Knowing our God is an awesome and powerful God, and that there is no limit to what we can achieve in His name, we felt He was calling us to set bigger, some might even say, impossible, goals. So, we did. Each of the four major goals we developed are centered on one of the four pillars of the FUPC Mission Statement: Meaningful Worship, Active Discipleship, Faithful Service, and Nurturing Fellowship. Since we will devote one full year to each goal, we are calling it Vision 2020.

Just imagine an FUPC where -

- · Every member of our church is confident that the church will help them through whatever physical and spiritual challenges they face.
- · Every church member can confidently speak and/or write about their relationship with God, and each church member has shared the Gospel with someone else by bringing them to church or personally witnessing their faith to another person.
- · We ensure every person in the Belleville area has access to some major need (such as food, shelter, or access to a drug treatment center) seven days a week and at least 75% of the average worship attendance participates in this endeavor.
- We provide worship opportunities that engage every learning style, every sense, and every emotional style.

We're still developing the milestones to achieve these goals and you will hear much more in the coming weeks and months. Because the goals are beyond big, every Elder, Deacon, and Trustee is committed to do their part to make them happen. But we need more; we need the support and commitment of every member of our congregation and we're confident we can count on you for that support.

Ways to Serve and Give

Stewardship – The Wellness Of Community

There is an African greeting which is in the form of a question about the health of the community: "How are the children?" The wellness of a community generally focuses on physical health however, the wellness of a community has many attributes: physical health, emotional health, mental health, social health, intellectual health, financial health, environmental health and spiritual health. A litmus test for community wellness is how do our children embrace others while demonstrating love, hope and grace.

Each year Racial Harmony has a community "Gathering" whose sole purpose is to recognize the positive contribution of the youth in the community. 
