MESSAGE "Learning From Our Mistakes"

2 Samuel 15-24 Page 494

More and more today...we hear people frustrated with polarization and what seems to be never ending rancor between camps of people supporting one political bunch or another.

And while I share that weariness...it is not new. For the past 8 weeks we have been following the books of 1st and 2nd Samuel, starting with the birth of Samuel as prophet...the evolution of Israel from a loose affiliation of tribes primarily led by Judges, to a monarchy led by a king. We followed the appointment of Saul as the 1st king of Israel, Saul's fall from grace with God, and then the rise of David as king.

We talked about how Israel experienced a very costly civil war when the division between Saul's supporters and David's supporters came to a head. People from the north, and especially the tribe of Benjamin supported Saul and his family. And the people from the south, especially the tribe of Judah ...supported David and his family.

Recently as we have started to wind up our series of stories about David, we see those same old animosities rearing their heads once again. A new Civil War erupts, this time between those who support David as king, and those who support David's son Absalom as king. In today's story the conflict between David and Absalom comes to a climactic conclusion.

As we come to the close of our time together considering David's life, and the absolute violence and conflict that marked his life and reign, it causes me to ponder several questions.

Towards the end of his reign, David seems very weary of violence, death and retribution as given ways of accomplishing his goals. 1) How does the message of Jesus stand in contrast to David's way of using manipulation, scheming, and force to attain one's goals?
2) How has David learned to wait on God to reveal his will, as opposed to forcing things to a particular outcome of his own design?

3) What does this have to say about how we learn the futility of grasping to have it all? 4) How do we learn the wisdom of simplicity and restraint?
5) Do we have to make our own versions of David's mistakes to learn what David learned?
