The Truth of the Resurrection

"For what I received I passed on to you as of first importance: that Christ died for our sins according to the Scriptures, that he was buried, that he was raised on the third day according to the Scriptures, and that he appeared to Cephas, and then to the Twelve. After that, he appeared to more than five hundred of the brothers and sisters at the same time, most of whom are still living, though some have fallen asleep. Then he appeared to James, then to all the apostles, and last of all he appeared to me also, as to one abnormally born." (1 Corinthians. 15:3-8) Paul penned these words, when writing to the church at Corinth, as a testimony to the truth of the resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ. He is risen. This is the most important truth that we have. This changes everything! Paul recognizes this a few verses later when he speaks of the importance of the resurrection by supposing that it wasn't really true. He says, "But if it is preached that Christ has been raised from the dead, how can some of you say that there is no resurrection of the dead? If there is no resurrection of the dead, then not even Christ has

been raised. And if Christ has not been raised, our preaching is useless and so is your faith. More than that, we are then found to be false witnesses about God. for we have testified about God that he raised Christ from the dead. But he did not raise him if in fact the dead are not raised. For if the dead are not raised. then Christ has not been raised either. And if Christ has not been raised, your faith is futile; you are still in your sins. Then those also who have fallen asleep in Christ are lost. If only for this life we have hope in Christ, we are of all people most to be pitied." (1 Corinthians. 15:12-19) If Christ is not risen then we are the most deceived, most heretical, and most pitiful people on the face of the planet. Why? Because everything we are as Christians hinges on this truth, "Christ died for our sins according to the Scripture...he was buried... he was raised on the third day according to the Scriptures..." I, with Paul, testify that this is true: Jesus Christ, our Lord, died and rose again. Let's live in the light of this truth every day.

## who have a first stroke have high blood pressure


STROKE: The 5th leading cause of death in America is also a major cause of severe, long-term disability. A stroke can happen at any age. A stroke happens when a clot or rupture interrupts blood flow to the brain. Without oxygenrich blood, brain cells die causing a person's speech, movement, or memory to be affected. TIA (transient ischemic attack) looks like a stroke, but symptoms resolve fairly quickly. A TIA can be a precursor to an actual stroke and medical treatment should be sought just as with an actual stroke. Up to 80% of strokes are preventable.

SYMPTOMS of a stroke or tia:

Sudden numbness or weakness of the face, arm or leg, especially on one side of the body.

Sudden confusion, trouble speaking or understanding.

Sudden trouble seeing in one or both eyes.



Sudden trouble walking, dizziness, loss of balance or coordination. Sudden severe headache with no known cause.

CALL 911: If you experience any of these symptoms or are with someone who is experiencing these symptoms call 911 and note the time they began. Some modes of treatment are dependent on the time interval from onset to treatment.

**UNCONTROLLABLE RISK FACTORS:** Age, sex, family history, ethnicity CONTROLLABLE RISK fACTORS: Control by behavioral changes or medical treatment

High blood pressure. Most people

high blood pressure Atrial fibrillation Diabetes

High cholesterol **Smoking** Sedentary lifestyle Being overweight Excess use of alcohol Stress

TAKE CHARGE OF YOUR HEALTH Manage your blood pressure, control cholesterol, reduce blood sugar, exercise 150 minutes a week, eat a diet rich in fruits and vegetables, low-fat dairy, lower saturated fats, lose weight if needed, stop smoking, reduce alcohol use and reduce stress. See your healthcare provider for guidance as needed.
