Our Global Missions committee began regularly supporting persecuted Christians through The Voice of Martyrs. Below are a few stories and prayer requests for those being persecuted for the cause of Christ.

Eight Christians Arrested During Church Service...

On Sunday, April 29th, about 25 police officers and Hindu activists burst into a church service and arrested eight Christians, accusing them of forcing Hindus to convert to Christianity. While five of the believers were soon released, three Christians from the same family - Subash; his wife, Sarah; and her sister, Lydia - were detained for weeks until finally being granted bail recently. Subash and his wife have ministered in their village

for years. According to a VOM worker, a Hindu group called Hindu Vidhinyay Perishad (HVP) is believed to be behind the arrests. The HVP is a legal group associated with the nationalist Hindutva movement. Pray that the case against these three believers will be dismissed.



As a regular practice Hindu activists accuse Christians of forced conversions so they are arrested.

Christian Girl Remains in Boko Haram Captivity...

Leah Sharibu remains in captivity almost four months after Boko Haram kidnapped her and 109 other school girls on February



19 from the Government Girls Science and Technical College in Yobe state. Most of the girls were returned about four weeks after the kidnapping, but five were reportedly killed and Leah is still being held. She is believed to be the only Christian among those kidnapped. One of the released girls said Leah hasn't been released because she refuses to deny Jesus. Pray that Leah will remain strong in faith and experience Christ's presence during her captivity. Also pray that she will be released soon and that her mother will be encouraged and strengthened during this ordeal. Pray that members of Boko Haram will be inspired by Lea's faith and seek to know the God she serves.

BLOOD **PRFSSURF** JUNE SCREENING: Eight people took advantage of the special family screening on June 3. We also provided screening for 16 others. There were 11 elevations: 10 female, 1 male.

The next screening will take place in September. If anyone needs a BP check before that date please contact Bobbie Dagostino or Sally Rhyner.

MELANOMA: Oregon, especially Central Oregon, has one of the highest incidences of melanoma in the U.S. Please remember to use your broadspectrum sunscreen every time you are outdoors. Even when it is cloudy. Reapply every 2 hours and after swimming or perspiring. Wear a hat and protective clothing whenever possible.



ATRIAL FIBRILLATION:

which An arrhythmia in disorganized electrical signals of the heart cause the upper chambers of the heart(atria) to contract very fast(fibrillate) irregularly. Contractions and are not efficient enough to properly empty blood from

atria into the lower chambers(ventricles). Pooled blood left in the atria may produce blood clots which can travel to and block arteries that supply blood to the brain resulting in an ischemic STROKE. A-Fib increases your chances of stroke 5 fold. Women who have A-Fib are at a higher risk of stroke and heart attack than men with A-Fib. The rapid heart rate causes stress on the heart muscle and can lead to heart failure or a worsening of existing heart failure. Heart failure is the result of a weakened heart muscle that cannot efficiently pump blood to the rest of the body. A-Fib is most often caused by damage to the heart. Common causes are heart disease, high blood pressure, structural heart defects, lung disease, hyperthyroidism, diabetes, obesity, sleep apnea, viral infections and aging. Half of those diagnosed with A-Fib are over 75 years of age.

SYMPTOMS

Symptoms of A-Fib include palpitations, rapid and irregular heartbeat, shortness of breath, weakness, chest pain, dizziness or fainting, fatigue, confusion. and anxiety. Many times there are no symptoms presented. If you think you might have

A-fib or might be at risk for A-Fib, talk with your healthcare provider. There are a variety of tests your health care provider can use to diagnose this condition.



TREATMENT

Treatment includes medications to control heart rate and rhythm and medications that prevent blood clots. Procedures to restore a regular heart rhythm such and cardioversion and ablation may be considered in some instances. Some patients may benefit from more invasive surgical procedures that destroy the heart tissue causing the arrhythmia.

PREVENTION

Prevention includes following a heart-healthy diet, maintaining healthy weight, getting more exercise, refraining from tobacco use, controlling alcohol and caffeine use, and treating conditions that put one at risk for A-Fib such as sleep apnea, high blood pressure, and high cholesterol.
