how powerful it is when God uses the passions he has already created in us to draw us to Himself. That is what FCA is all about...God using people's passion for sports and competition, to draw them to Himself.

This past year we were blessed to witness God demonstrate this in so many lives. He used the passion for their sport, their desire to improve, and their drive to succeed to open pathways to reveal to their hearts their need for the Savior. The story below is a real example of just that.

It begins with a young a middleschooler with a passion for baseball, who was invited by a friend to attend an FCA huddle at his school. As this boy began attending the FCA ministry week after week, he heard his peers share their faith and learned about Jesus. Soon he too came to the realization that he needed Jesus, and accepted the grace and forgiveness He offered, making Him lord of his life. Praise God! But the story doesn't end



there. The young baseball'r began attending a local church and continued to participate with FCA at school. The change in the life of their son didn't go unnoticed by his parents. Dad, a fairly well known and accomplished baseball coach, in-particular became aware of his son's transformation. As the school year was coming to an end, this aspiring baseball player expressed his desire to attend our FCA sports camp. Dad, already intrigued by the impact FCA was having on his son, sought out our head baseball clinician Sean Rooney, and asked if he could be a part of the coaching staff for the week at camp as well. Coach Rooney questioned the father as to his beliefs and was informed in very clear and emphatic terms that he was not a Christian and although he allowed for the possibility that there was a God, he did not believe in Jesus, at all, period, end of story. After prayerfully considering whether or not it was wise to permit a nonbelieving coach to serve at camp, our Coach Rooney felt led by the Spirit to allow this dad to attend the afternoon clinical sessions, in a limited coaching capacity. After the first afternoon the boy's father was so impressed with the environment and what he was witnessing, he began to ask questions of the coaching staff about just what is was that made this so different. Coach Rooney suggested that he attend the evening all camp chapel and hear more, so he did; and then again on the second night, and the

Spirit became so great on his heart that he stepped

out and ask Jesus to forgive his sins and come into his life and reign as his Savior and Lord!

Praise Jesus for this victory! And, praise God for the shared passion for baseball that this father and son had! Now in addition they also share a common eternal destiny through their faith in Christ.

I love to share this story because it illustrates what can happen when God uses our passion for sport to draw us to the saving knowledge of Jesus! And because it shows how the different ministry efforts of FCA intersect.



There are so many stories like this from this past year. It blows my mind to think that God has been using this ministry in this way for over 65 years! STOP THE BLEED

Stop the Bleed is a national awareness campaign and call-to-action!

The intention of Stop the Bleed is to educate, equip, and empower bystanders to help in a bleeding emergency before professional help arrives. matter how quickly emergency professionals arrive, bystanders will always be first on the scene. First responders take an average of seven minutes to arrive, but a person can die from blood loss within five minutes! Therefore. it is important to quickly stop bleeding. 20% of deaths from injuries could have survived with quick bleeding control.

Since Stop the Bleed was launched in 2017, over 1 million people have been trained. However, the Committee on Trauma takes this call to action seriously. Their goal

is to train every American in basic bleeding control techniques and place bleed control kits in every public venue, including schools, stadiums, and churches. Our security team already has kits in place at Foundry Church.

On Saturday, March 14th, Foundry Church is offering a Stop the Bleed class lasting approximately 90 minutes. Following a presentation, you'll gain the ability to recognize life-threatening bleeding intervene effectively. You will learn three quick techniques to help save a life: (1) How to use your hands to apply pressure to a wound; (2) How to pack a wound to control bleeding; and (3) How to correctly apply a tourniquet. Those nearest to someone with life threatening injuries are best

positioned to provide first care. Take the course and become empowered to make a life or death difference when a bleeding emergency occurs. Stop the Bleed. Save a Life!

We had a great time at our snow shoeing activity in February. Thanks to Kevin Donaldson heading this up and to all of our adults who helped chaperone. It was so much fun!










We will continue to meet each evening from 6:30-Monday 8:00pm. However, we will be taking the Monday of Spring Break off and will not be meeting.
