For the Guys

Alright guys, this month I'm talking to you. Time to grow your mustache... It's Movember.

Our fathers, husbands, brothers, sons, and friends are facing a health crisis, yet it's rarely talked about: men are dying too young. We cannot afford to stay silent anymore; men's health is in crisis for largely preventable reasons. Unchecked, they predict prostate cancer rates will double over the next 15 years. Globally, testicular cancer is the most common cancer among men aged 15-39 years of age. Men, know your numbers! At the age of 50, talk to your doctor about prostate cancer and whether it's right for you to have a PSA test. If you are African American or have a father or brother with prostate cancer, you should be having this conversation at 45. (Women, it's ok to "nag" the guys about this one). Also, educate yourself about testicular cancer. This is the most common cancer of men under 40. Besides having an annual exam performed by your health care provider, men also need to perform monthly self-exams. If something doesn't feel right, call your doctor. Across the world, one man dies by suicide every minute of every day, with males accounting for 75% of all suicides.

To complicate matters, going into the holidays during a pandemic with events and family gatherings being canceled is only going to exacerbate feelings of loneliness throughout the holidays. Here are five things we can all do. (Gals, we need to pay attention too.)

First and foremost, we need to spend time with people who make us feel good. Of course, with COVID-19, we need to be mindful of precautions, but make sure you are staying connected. Family, friends, and life groups are important and spending time with them is good for us. Try to catch up regularly whether in person or via phone or Zoom. Having a set day and time can help ensure you are checking in. This may sound redundant but another thing we all need to do is talk more. Just because two people are meeting, does not mean they are truly reaching out. A person doesn't have to be an expert or the sole solution but listening can be lifesaving.

This is a two-way street: we need to listen but we also need to talk. 70% of men say their friends can rely on them for support, but only 48% say that they rely on their friends. In other words: we're here for our friends, but don't ask for help for ourselves. Reaching out is crucial. Just like Pastor Trevor said in his sermon about King David's Mighty Men, many of us are good at "hiding in plain sight". Having someone to talk to is invaluable. If you don't

feel that you have a safe person, please reach out to the Foundry Ministry staff, the Health Ministry, or ask to join a Life Group. Get your Mighty Men (or Mighty Women)! Last, but not least, we all need to move more! Add more activity to your day and do more of what makes you feel good. Walking outside appears to be a COVID safe way to socialize. You can also park further away from the store entrance, use the stairs instead of the elevator, or cycle to work instead of driving. If you need other ideas or tips on how to stay more active, please reach out to the Health Ministry Team. I will always be here to help you get creative and come up with ideas to stav active and healthy.

Let's all get serious about our mental health. Gals, let's advocate for the men in our lives. And guys, make your health a priority and put away your razors for Movember. And hey, if your mustache doesn't look good, just wear a mask to cover it up.
