Flu Season and COVID-10

Flu season has begun, and this year, the continuing coronavirus pandemic will complicate the picture. Both COVID-19 and “the flu” are contagious respiratory illnesses spread through infected particles in the air and can cause severe illness. Unfortunately, they will be difficult to tell apart.

If you come down with any kind of illness (fever, cough, congestion, sneezing, sore throat, runny nose, nausea, vomiting, diarrhea or any other symptoms of infectious illness), the best thing to do is call your doctor and explain your symptoms, stay home and self-quarantine, and/or follow your doctor’s recommendations. It is likely they will recommend that you are tested for the flu and COVID-19.

COLD & FLU PRECAUTIONS:

1. Care for yourself and your family. Good nutrition, plenty of rest, proper hydration, regular exercise, and stress management are key to staying healthy.
2. Protect yourself. Even if you are tired of following coronavirus precautions such as wearing a mask, it is especially important to keep up the good work! Wash your hands frequently, clean and sanitize, wear a

face mask, and physically distance. Encourage your family to do the same.

3. Protect those around you. Please remember those in our church and community who are immunosuppressed or have underlying health conditions. Now, more than ever, we need to protect those around us: please stay home when you are sick, practice good hand washing, physical distance, and wear a mask.

4. Get a flu shot. It is hard to predict how bad the seasonal flu will be. Even if you usually skip a flu shot, this is the year to get one. The flu shot is updated to protect you against the three or four worst strains that are expected to show up this season. We are very blessed in central Oregon to have readily available resources to members of our community:

- a. Contact your healthcare provider
- b. Contact a School Based Health Center (for kids 0-18) (541) 383-3005
- c. Call Deschutes County Immunization Clinic located at 2577 NE Courtney Drive in Bend to make an appointment at (541) 322-7499. Immunizations are provided for

children 0 - 18 years old regardless of payer source. Vaccines are also available to those between 18 and older who are uninsured.

Services will not be denied based on insurance coverage or ability to pay. However, they do not provide high dose vaccines for those 65 and older. d. For those 65 and older, it is recommended that you receive a “high dose vaccine”. These are available at most local pharmacies. Ask your doctor if you should get a pneumonia shot, too.

e. <https://vaccinefinder.org/> Maintaining healthy habits through the cold and flu season will not only help prevent COVID-19 but other fall and winter illnesses as well. As always, feel free to reach out to our Health Ministry team with questions, if you need assistance getting to medical appointments, or help finding a flu shot clinic.
