Four More Simple Ways to Improve Your Marriage

There isn't a pill you can take to magically transform your bad or mediocre marriage into a good one. It takes incremental, intentional steps toward one another over time to gradually build marital harmony.

Improving Your Marriage, One Step at a Time

- 1. Say "You look beautiful/handsome." This is especially important for men to remember, as wives want few things more than to be beautiful for their husbands. Ladies, this is important for you as well. He may not act like he cares how he looks, but letting him know that you find him attractive as he walks out the door for the day will do wonders for his outlook.
- 2. **Put the phone down.** You may be perfectly able to multi-task, carrying on a conversation with your spouse while texting or surfing social media. However, the message your body language is sending is that whatever's on your phone is more important than the person in front of you.
- 3. **Pursue your mate sexually.** Life can be crazy—long hours at work, juggling kids' schedules. You may be drifting apart emotionally and sexually disinterested. But without sex, your spouse is simply a best friend or roommate. For wives it is simple; initiate love making. Few things bring greater joy to a man. For men, it's a bit more nuanced. You will need to flirt with her and warm her up during the day by sending her messages letting her know how you feel.
- 4. **Be the first to apologize.** Nobody likes conflict, but everyone has it. If you're wrong, apologize...quickly. Do not try to defend or justify your actions; doing so offsets the sincerity of your apology. If your spouse apologizes to you, be generous in your forgiveness.


