Mission Week 2012

The mission teams have an exciting, informative conference and week planned for you. Mission Week starts with the conference on Saturday, February 4 at 8:30am in Ferguson Hall. The keynote speaker is Caroline Kurtz, a mission worker with Presbyterian Frontier Fellowship. Her topic is **SAME GOSPEL, DIFFERENT WORLD**. There will also be four outstanding breakout leaders representing Medical Benevolence Foundation, The Outreach Foundation, the Crescent Project and a domestic missionary to Sacramento. The cost is \$25 in advance or \$30 at the door including continental breakfast and lunch.

Besides the mission conference here are some other opportunities to hear how Fremont partners with those sharing the love of Christ in Sacramento and around the world:

Sunday, January 29 – Skip Ohs will make a presentation about his recent trip to Ethiopia with East Africa Village Outreach at 10:15 in the Chapel as a lead-in to Mission Week.

Sunday, February 5 – Dr. Rob Weingartner will discuss “*What in the World is God Doing?*” at 10:15 in the Chapel. Dr. Weingartner is Executive Director of the Outreach Foundation. There will also be **mission displays and activities** in Ferguson Hall from 10 to 12:30.

Tuesday, February 7 – Annette and Byron Harrison, Wycliffe Bible translation workers, will speak about their work (following the congregational meeting).

Thursday, February 9 – Representatives from two of our local mission partners, **Francis House** and **Clean and Sober**, will speak at Dr. Baird’s Thursday morning Bible study at 10am.

From Pastor Don

I was asked, the other day, what all this “denominational business” was “really” about. As you have both heard and read over the past months, it is about the Authority of Scripture, the Centrality of Christ and the Hierarchy of our Church. As I spoke with this friend, I became convinced that more of an explanation may be needed than this one-liner.

I came across a paper from First Presbyterian Church of Orlando that does an excellent job of communicating the issues. I have used excerpts from it to attempt to explain the issues through Fremont’s eyes.

The PCUSA currently operates under two profoundly different lines of theology. Throughout the years, Fremont Presbyterian Church of Sacramento has stood firm in support of a “Traditional Reformed” understanding of Scripture (also sometimes referred to as “orthodox” or “historical”). While most in our denomination also hold this view, an increasing number of PCUSA congregations and leaders hold equally firm to seeing Scripture through a very different lens of what is now commonly referred to as “progressive” theology.

Progressive theology regards the Bible as having a measure of authority. However, as it is fundamentally viewed as the experience and insights of human authors in a particular historic setting rather than divinely-authored truth, its principles must be reinterpreted and applied in each new cultural setting. It is not absolute truth, but instead, an ever-changing one. As a result, the Bible becomes more of a guide for our faith and our life together rather than an authoritative rule. As the PCUSA’s new Ordination Standards state, “Governing bodies shall be guided by Scripture and the confessions in applying standards to individual candidates.” For the Progressives, how one “experiences” God takes on added significance, even to the point of bringing new definitions of who God is and what He does, as the controversial “ReImagining Conference” did 20 years ago.

Traditional Reformed theology accepts Scripture as the only written revelation of God. It is inspired or “God-breathed” (2 Timothy 3:16) and thus not to be edited or changed to fit a more comfortable contemporary perspective (John 17:17, Psalm 19:7-11). Scripture carries the authority of God’s rule over us and contains His commands, His promises, and His plan for salvation. Therefore, as human beings we are to submit to Scripture’s authority. As Reformed Christians, we do hold that varying insights may be held within the Scripture on certain doctrines and practices (i.e. infant vs. adult baptism), but Traditional Reformed theology affirms that an interpretation of Scripture will never fall outside the explicitly written Word of God contained in the Old and New Testaments.

These divergent theologies both claim the Lordship of Christ, but with significantly different interpretations. Traditional Reformed theology believes unequivocally that Jesus Christ is “the Way” (John 14:6) and “the Door” (John 10:9). Salvation is through faith in Christ alone (John 3:16, Romans 3:24, 5:1, Acts 4:12). Progressive theology espouses a wide range of beliefs, from Jesus being “one way” among many, to a universal understanding that views Christ’s redemptive sacrifice as payment for all, regardless of belief. As the PCUSA’s new Form of Government says, “God unites persons through baptism regardless of... theological conviction.” A common refrain heard by candidates seeking ordination is “for me, Christ is my savior, but I cannot say how God may choose to do it in the lives of others.” We believe such thought attacks the very core of Christian faith: the cross and resurrection of Jesus Christ.

We are convinced that the Gospel of the ages is as relevant and appealing today as it has ever been. Even more important, this time-tested Gospel is the only Truth we know and to share anything other than that Truth would be the height of disobedience to God (1 Timothy 3:3-7; 11 Thess. 2:10-13).

Fremont’s Session believes that in the PCUSA’s effort to embrace those who hold these strongly divergent theologies, “diversity” seems now to be more essential than holding fast to the Biblical moorings of our faith. Many in our denomination sincerely believe there is much to be gained by embracing both views and living within the “dialogue.” However, as a matter of conscience, the Session believes that it is unfaithful to God, His Word and

Luis Palau Sacramento Festival June 16 - 17, 2012

Luis Palau (loo-EES puh-LAOW) and his ministry have shared the Gospel with more than 1 billion people through evangelistic events and media. He has spoken in person to 25 million people in 72 countries with more than 1 million registered decisions for Jesus Christ. He has authored close to 50 books and countless articles on issues of faith and counseled business and political leaders and heads of state around the world.

The Luis Palau Sacramento Festival, to be held June 16-17, 2012 at Cal Expo, is a powerful opportunity for churches and believers to unite and reach our community with the Good News of Jesus Christ. It is a call to pray for the lost in Sacramento, and to serve in one of the many Season of Service projects – sharing a vision to help the least fortunate. It will provide activities for families, children, teenagers, young adults, and adults. There will be a family fun zone, extreme sports events, Christian rock and gospel music, with the Gospel preached each evening by Luis Palau.

Please pray about your involvement in partnering with God for perhaps one of the greatest spiritual awakenings in the history of Sacramento and our lifetime. For the rest of the winter quarter in KIDS Church we will be following the sermon series. That means your K-5th grade student will be talking about the same thing in their church hour that you have talked about in yours! **2) The Children's Ministry Team...** did you know that it takes 27 adults and youth to teach our FPC kids every Sunday? We have a team of people who make it a priority to come to church on Sunday to make a difference in the lives of the children & families of our church! (Thank you teachers!) **3) Bible Sunday...**on March 25th the Sunday School classes come together in Ferguson Hall to celebrate what God is doing in FPC Sunday School. 

Jamaica Medical Mission Team

Twelve volunteers from Fremont will be joining a larger team of 45 volunteers from Hope and Health to Jamaica in Manchester Parish, Jamaica. This team will be providing medical and dental care and spiritual encouragement to the people of rural Jamaica.

Physicians: Pat Tansey-Mitzner, MD; Heather Hoffmeyer, MD. There will be three medical teams. Each will have a pediatrician and two adult physicians to see and exam patients, diagnosis illness, and prescribe necessary medications.

Dentists: Ron Rott, DDS; Wesley Yee, DDS. The two dental teams will evaluate and remove teeth and educate on proper oral hygiene. They will also do limited cleanings and fillings.

Nurses: Pam Cappelletti, Grace Lopez Cox, Vicki Meyer, Katee Schaffer. They will triage patients, document chief complaints, and take patients' blood pressures, temperatures, and occasion blood sugars. They may work in the pharmacy educating patients on their illness and necessary medications.

Pharmacist: Nancy Yee. The pharmacists will fill the prescriptions prescribed by our physicians with the donated medications and explain the medications and their purposes to the Jamaican patients.

General Helpers: Kathy Lewis, Janice Stone Thomas, Deanna Vattuone. General helpers will assist with crowd control; run charts from clinic nurses to our nurses and run charts from the doctors to the pharmacy; help count pills in pharmacy, and be responsible for lunch preparation for the clinic team.

Construction: There will be a construction team working to replace the roof of an orphanage damaged by hurricanes.



We have packed, itemized, and weighed (50 lb baggage limit) a total of 17 bins of vitamins, dental supplies, and other medications as additional baggage. These were purchased with the generous donations from our Fremont family.

All team members will be conducting devotions and witnessing to the love that Jesus Christ has for all people. The Jamaica Medical Mission team would appreciate your commitment to upholding us in prayer:

- *For safe travel – during our flights, and during van trips between base camp and the clinics*
- *God's blessings as we process all the donated medications through customs and that all the medications will be available at the start of the project.*
- *For each clinic team to work together well and have fun*
- *Allowing God to work through us as we minister to His people.*
- *The capacity to be flexible and understanding of the culture and the needs of the Jamaican people*
- *Create hearing and open hearts to hear the Good News of Jesus Christ*
- *Willingness to experience God's blessings through the Jamaican people*

Following are some action and informational items from the Session meeting of December 21, which might be of interest to the general congregation. These notes are not intended to reflect the total work of the Session at the meeting. If you are interested in more information about a particular item, please contact any member of Session.

First, thank you, again, to Patti Dusel who served as Clerk Pro-Tem for this meeting and prepared the minutes from which this article was drawn. Patti has been a faithful Clerk Pro Tem for several years. As she is now serving as a Ruling Elder, she will no longer be able to serve in my place. Thank you, Patti, for your continuing, faithful service to Fremont.

This was the last meeting for the Session Class of 2011. Those completing their terms were Andy Bodemeijer, Sean Doherty, Brooks Erickson, Dan Johnson and Clair Parsh. Each of those present was honored for his service and given a book. Delicious desserts were provided by Pam Dolk and Ann Bruce as thanks to Session for its service during the year. Many thanks to them from Session for their extra efforts and the cheer they brought to the meeting.

There was a special report from Parish Nurse Carmen Enz and Martha Lake, a member of the Health Ministry Team, on Fremont's Faith Food Fitness Challenge 2012.

There was an update to Session from the Negotiating Team. As of the date of the meeting, Fremont's Negotiating Team had not been invited to meet with Presbytery's Negotiating Team. A called Presbytery meeting had been announced to consider establishing an Administrative Commission.

There was also an update on the 2012 Budget. Final budget action will be taken at the January Session meeting.

The Financial Report for October showed General Fund revenues (total) were \$121,901 and expenses were \$152,408, giving a loss for the month of \$30,508. Year-to-date revenues of \$1,545,489 were less-than-budget by \$38,878, and year-to-date expenses of \$1,682,061 were less-than-budget by \$50,951, giving a year-to-date loss of \$136,572, with a variance from Budget of a surplus of \$12,074.

ACTIONS:

- Approved the calendar for serving communion in 2012.
- Appointed Bob Schroeder as Session representative from the College of Elders to the 2012 Nominating Committee.
- Elected Elaine Moody to serve as Clerk of Session in 2012 and Carol Wyatt and Patty Howard to serve as Clerks Pro Tem in 2012.
- Appointed commissioners to represent Fremont at the called Presbytery meeting (to be held January 9).
- Supported planning a prayer vigil for January 9.
- Created an organized pastoral outreach from the Session asking how Session can meet the needs of those members wanting to stay in the PC(USA).

and feel and confess myself a stranger and a pilgrim here.


Afford me all the direction, defense, support, and a consolation

Feed the Hungry

Between February and April, what will you do to Feed the Hungry of Sacramento? The words of Christ are clear, if we do not Feed the Hungry, then we are seriously lacking in our faithfulness to the gospel. Christ literally commanded us to Feed the Hungry. But, where do we start with such a command?

First of all, it is helpful if we understand that there are hungry people. It can be so easy to 'fall asleep' to the problems of the world around us. However, right in your neighborhood there are people who are hungry. Some are quite literally hungry for food, while others are spiritually hungry. Can you imagine someone who has never had someone say "I love you" with the heart of Christ? That's the real hunger that we're talking about. Of course, in so many ways, we've already been doing this at Fremont for years. Through our ministries, missions and programs, every year we have reached tens of thousands of people and shared the love of Christ with them in countless ways. Quite literally, everything we do at Fremont is about responding to Christ's command to Feed the Hungry.

If Jesus were teaching right now, you could almost imagine someone asking him, "Jesus. Who are the hungry?" In one way, I can see him looking at us and saying, "Come on. You don't know?" And, he'd be right. Have you ever started eating a meal and said, "Wow! This is good. I didn't know how hungry I was." For me, I've had that feeling when I first felt at home in a church, when I first allowed myself to be carried away by the words of Christ, when I first wept over the lack of justice in this world, when I first had someone say thank you with tears in their eyes, when I saw a family come back to life again, when I saw a true friendship take root and when I clearly felt God saying "I love you."

The most profound realization for me was that it wasn't just the world that was hungry for Christ, it was myself who was hungry to live out the gospel. When we have the gospel in our laps, on our plates and in our heads, but there is no real response to it, we become completely emaciated. For many people who are victims of starvation, the first meal is not a pleasant experience. It is as though their bodies have an aversion to food. Somehow, their brains have been tricked into thinking that food isn't good. But, then they try a small bite and the nutrients get absorbed. Slowly, they are brought back to health. Slowly and surely they find themselves being made alive. Now, how will you respond to the gospel command of Jesus to Feed the Hungry? I'd suggest that you consider just trying it.

This year we have an array of opportunities to serve the community. Season of Service, where we are joining with 500 other churches throughout Sacramento, will last from February-April, Go Day is April 14th and the Mission Conference on February 4th will get you charged up. Also, we are now going to be a distribution point for the Central Downtown Food Basket beginning in April, with the hope of addressing needs of those in our immediate community who are temporarily jobless. Look for the Feed the Hungry cards at Fremont for ideas on how you can start to Feed the Hungry.




