HEALTHY BYTES

Soda



The average American, in the year 2000, drank 53 gallons of soda (yes, per person!)...it is now down to 40 gallons of soft drinks per year. Better, but not great; that's still a lot of pop! Aside from the fact that soda contributes to our obesity and disease, (yes, even you diet soda drinkers - read the statistics: diet soda makes you GAIN weight) it is now known that it is associated with Out-of-Hospital Cardiac Arrests (OHCA).

A cardiac arrest is when the heart suddenly stops pumping blood throughout the body. It is not the same as a heart attack, that is when the supply of blood to the heart is suddenly blocked, most often caused by a blood clot. OHCA is usually an electrical problem. Americans have a lot of OHCA's each year.

In a recent study in Japan involving 800,000 people, they found that those who spent more money on carbonated beverages were more likely to suffer cardiac arrests. This study is the first to make a link between drinking large amounts of carbonated beverages and OHCA. They think it is the acid in the soda that plays an important part in this link. Drinking green tea, black tea, coffee, cocoa, fruit or vegetable juice, fermented milk beverage, milk and mineral water were not found to be associated with OHCA's. We already knew that soda leads to type 2 diabetes and heart disease, this is just one more reason to get it out of your diet.
