

Theme: Because of Christ, I am...

Objective: To understand the transition between the Old Testament Covenants and the new promises brought through Christ

Opening Question: What do you plan to do for Thanksgiving?

Read Hebrews 7:22-8:7

- Which verses stand out to you? In what way?
- In what way is Jesus a more complete High Priest than what the Israelites had previously known?
- Why does the writer of Hebrews believe the Old Covenant needed to be replaced?

What are some of the differences between Old Covenant and the New Covenant? Read through the passage and identify some of the expectations of the Old Covenant and how those have changed under the New Covenant.

Old Covenant Expectations	New Covenant Expectations

- From the list you have generated, which of the expectations speaks directly to you in your current life situation?
- Which of the New Covenant expectations did you needed to be reminded of? In other words, do you ever act or behave like you are under the Old Covenant?

Read Jeremiah 31:31-34, Hebrews 8:8-13, and Hebrews 9:11-15

- The Old Covenant was written around 1400 B.C. 800 years later, Jeremiah was written. Hebrews, written to help explain the transition between the Old and the New Covenants, was written around 70 A.D. What does this say about God’s faithfulness in our lives?
- What is the greatest truth you can pull from these passages?
- Read Hebrews 9:14—What was God’s purpose in sending his Son to die for our sins and establish and new covenant?
