THE SCHOOL

Founded in 1973 and accredited by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools, Friendship Christian School is a nondenominational, college preparatory, coeducational day school.

Located on a 50 acre campus approximately 30 miles east of Nashville, FCS consists of preschool, kindergarten, elementary, middle school, and high school. Our facilities include separate classroom buildings for each school, a multi-purpose performing arts center, two libraries, two computer labs, and an extensive athletic complex (gym, weight-training facilities, indoor hitting and pitching facility, football, soccer, baseball and softball fields).

STUDENT BODY

The total student body population is 600 students, fairly evenly divided between elementary, middle school, and high school. The Class of 2011 numbers 50 students; 100% plan to enroll at a college or university next year.

FACULTY

The middle school and high school faculty includes 37 teachers and administrators; 17 have advanced degrees. The teacher to student ratio is 12:1. The average class size is 16.

GRADE POINT AVERAGE

Grade point average is cumulative. The GPA on a student's transcript is unweighted and calculated according to the following scale:

HONORS DIPLOMA REQUIREMENTS (24 Credits)

An Honors Diploma is offered to students who choose a more rigorous course of study. To qualify for participation in the Honors Program, students must receive a grade of 93 in the college preparatory course, or a 90 in a previous honors course, and must have a teacher recommendation.
