Lisa works on public policy issues and initiatives related to eradicating sexual trafficking and commercial sexual exploitation. She also assists in the development of strategies for The Salvation Army to create recovery services for survivors of sexual trafficking.

Lisa writes on topics such as sexual trafficking and commercial sexual exploitation. She has provided expert testimony to the U.S. Congress and also routinely speaks and facilitates

training for a variety of audiences. Prior to her arrival at The Salvation Army, Lisa served as Policy Representative for the National Association of Evangelicals' (NAE) Office for Governmental Affairs in Washington, DC., being heavily involved in NAE's efforts seeking passage of legislation now known as the Trafficking Victims Protection Act of 2000.

Lisa has earned a Bachelor of Arts degree in government from Western Kentucky University, as well as a Master's degree in leadership, public policy and social issues from Union Institute and University.
