Human Trafficking in Hampton Roads - How Faith Communities Can Help

Human trafficking is a form of modern day slavery where people profit from the control and exploitation of others. Today, around the world, 27 million persons are said to be enslaved in conditions of forced labor or sexual servitude. In the US there are estimated to be 100,000 children involved in child prostitution and sex trafficking. Human trafficking is one of the fastest growing criminal industries in the world.

This form of exploitation happens in all 50 states...and Hampton Roads is not immune to it. In an effort to begin to raise awareness and address this problem in our region, Lori and Patrick McKenna founded the Virginia Beach Justice Initiative (VBJI) in 2011 as a call to action; a call to prayer. Their vision was for local faith communities to "champion" this cause.

In December 2012, the VBJI partnered with Regent University's Center for Global Justice and the Protecting Children Foundation to host a Regional Summit on Human Trafficking. From that event, more than 30 different organizations (including local law enforcement, civic organizations, nonprofit organizations, faith groups, shelters, and government agencies, etc.) committed to be part of a regional task force to further collaborate on how to better identify and address the problem of human trafficking and the needs of its victims. This task force, now called the Hampton Roads Coalition Against Trafficking (HRCAT), meets monthly.

Mr. and Mrs. McKenna will speak on local human trafficking and the work of the Virginia Beach Justice Initiative. Officer Jim McElligott, who has also been involved with this initiative, will speak from the perspective of the Crime Prevention Division of the Virginia Beach Police Department. Both will share their thoughts on how faith communities can best be of service.

FROM THE RECTOR

Dear Friends,

One of the marks of a converted heart for Jesus is an increasing care in your life for the broken, the hurting and the poor. In John 12, Jesus says: *The poor will always be with you*. As your heart becomes cruciform, you will look, more and more, look for opportunities to serve as He served. The earliest Christians made it their business not only to share about Jesus, but also to care for the needs of the poor--at home and far away.

With the pace and complexity of life, many feel hard pressed to step outside ourselves for regular outreach--and yet it's essential. At Galilee we do all we can to encourage you to make that step. Short-term mission trips are one of many ways to do that. Short-term missions are expensive, but going to a third-world nation and caring for others has a long term benefit for you: You'll become more aware of your own blessings, and you'll live more intentionally with what you have. You'll also care more, here at home, for the needs of the poor--and you'll likely pray more. See inside this NET for information on an upcoming short-term mission to Uganda--where you can make an actual, palpable difference in people's lives by installing solar power at (for example) orphanages. Next November there will be another opportunity to serve on the Dominican Republic medical mission.

While Galilee can't cover the *entire* cost of an adult short-term mission, we do have limited scholarship funds available--and you can apply to receive them by contacting the parish office.

WARDEN'S REPORT

Your Vestry enjoyed a wonderful retreat in late February and set aside most of the time to talk through the needs of the church as we move forward. Our church has been blessed with steady growth in attendance since our new clergy arrived, and with that growth comes changes in the way the church "feels".

We averaged approximately 350 attendees on an average week in the year before Andy Buchanan arrived, and that number grew to over 460 in 2012. The increase in our parishioners of 30% is a tremendous blessing, but it also changes the church in some ways - the percentage of familiar faces goes down, the personal attention available from Andy goes down, and the potential for individuals within the church to feel left out goes up.

Anticipating that we will continue to grow, and hoping to do so with prayer and preparation, we spent time at our Vestry retreat studying an article entitled "Leadership and Church Size Dynamics (How Strategy Changes With Growth)". Many of us felt that during Galilee's last growth surge in the mid 2000's, the rapid pace led to a disconnect between groups of parishioners, leading to friction and worry instead of praise and worship for the growth in God's kingdom. We now have the benefit of looking back in history and learning from it to ensure we do a good job going forward.

One initiative that the article encouraged and that the Vestry agreed with was to Increase Intentionality around welcoming those people coming to the church. The article notes - "The larger the church, the more systematic and deliberate the assimilation of newcomers needs to be"

We felt that if we do a good job of embracing and incorporating visitors and new attendees, they will not be strangers long, and they can more quickly become a true part of our community. We will let you know more about this initiative as our plans evolve, but I want to thank all of you because I feel that Galilee is already a very welcoming church, and we hope to stay that way as we grow.



GALILEE MONTESSORI-A SHORT HISTORY LESSON: PART 1

Are you wondering who Maria Montessori was? Maria Montessori was not an educator by training; she was a medical doctor. In fact, she was the first woman to obtain a Doctor of Medicine degree from the University of Rome in1896. Her dissertation was in neurology. In addition to her own medical practice, she worked with hospitalized children with serious learning disorders. She had studied the physiological method of Edouard Seguin in depth and applied and furthered his approach of stimulating the mind through the education of the senses. The results were so extraordinary the name of Dr. Maria Montessori became well known. She



then studied anthropology and observed and researched in schools, preparing herself to apply her discoveries to normal children.
