Dear Friends,

In three weeks our Thailand Missions Team is going to be leaving for a small village in Thailand named Kew Mai Sang. This small village has 11 homes and 58 people with no school and no Christians. They do not have clean water or restrooms in the village. Our goal is to work with our American Baptist Missionaries, Mike & Becky and their son, Rick, to bring water to the village, purify it with a filter system, build storage tanks, and build restrooms. The Manns have done this in over 270 villages in Northern Thailand, so we will supply the muscle to complete these projects for the Kew Mai Sang village. Part of the funds for this Thailand outreach came from our 2013 Advent Conspiracy, and each member of the team raised about 25% of the balance. Your team, led by Pastor Eiji, is:

One of the questions raised was, "Why not just send the money to build wells for 2 villages instead of this team going?" The Manns gave us a very compelling answer. Yes, we could build an extra well. It would be more cost effective. But what is more important is the Gospel of Christ. These are Buddhist villages, and to have American Christians come to this small village and labor for a week tells the village how important and loved they are in our eyes. Americans are with them, caring for them, living with them, and meeting their needs in love, which opens the door for the Gospel of Christ.

Christmas, the celebration of the Christ child coming to earth to be with us is the opening to the story, the Good News. God loved us, cared for us, ministered to us and died for us. Our going to Kew Mai Sang village in Thailand opens the door for God's love. It's a demonstration of what love does and what's important. It's Emmanuel – God with us.

Pray for the strength of your team as we leave on January 8 and return January 20, 2015. Pray that we are able to accomplish the tasks. Pray for the Kew Mai Sang village (see picture). Pray for the joy of the Lord in all we do. Pray for the making of disciples of Christ in the Kew Mai Sang village.



Bob & Teresa Matsushima, Mercy Ships in Madagascar Short-term Mission

What comes to mind when you hear Madagascar? Is it the animated movie with colorful jungle scenes, big-eyed lemurs, and growling, jungle animals? Well, Bob and I will be serving on Africa Mercy, a surgical ship currently docked in Madagascar. We will be leaving Thursday, January 22, 2015 and return on Tuesday, March 31. Did you know Africa has 25% of the disease burden in the world with only 3% of health care workers? This was a surprising statistic which has moved us to serve in Africa.

In December 2012, Bob and I accompanied 18 GVBC'ers to the Urbana International Missions conference in St. Louis, MO. It was a wonderful time, worshipping in a cavernous stadium with 16,000 college students raising their hands to the Lord; snow falling on us as we walked the city blocks looking for our next seminar; eating on a tight color-coded schedule and when the bell dinged, you had to quickly leave to make room for the next group of 4,000 diners. We had midnight meetings with the pizza-eating college students and God was working on us, breaking our hearts for the poor and disenfranchised people of the third world. It was then that God called Bob to the Mercy Ships ministry. Before we left for the conference, our wise daughter told Bob, "Dad, make sure you pray before you enter the exhibition hall. That is what I did when I went, and God led me straight to the Mission Year booth. He will lead you to the right place, but you have to pray first." Thus, proving our children are often wiser and lead us.



Many people have approached us asking questions like, "You aren't still going to Africa are you? What about your new granddaughter? What about your new grandchild due in March? You will be gone? Aren't you worried? It's a bad idea to go to Africa now with Ebola. WHAT are you thinking?" But, when God calls, we respond in faith because the Lord has this all in His hand. Of course we are worried. Of course we wonder what will happen in Africa. Of course I am terrified of Ebola, and I worry for my kids and grandkids, as well as my Mom with dementia. We have to trust that the Lord is in control and whatever happens is in His will. Bob and I have prayerfully come to terms with the possibility that we might not return. We even might get sick and have to be left in Africa. And, I reflected upon the missionaries of the early 19th Century who packed their belongings in a coffin as they didn't last the year on the mission field. We had to come to terms with dying and not returning to our home and family and church. But we are claiming the entire Psalm 91:

- ...God is my refuge and my fortress, My God in whom I trust. (vs. 2)
- ...He delivers you from the deadly pestilence. (vs. 3)
 - You will not be afraid...(vs. 5)

He will give His angels charge concerning you, to guard you in all your ways (vs. 11)

So, we put our trust in God and pray HIS will be done through us, through our hands, through our lives, through our service and through our commitment to serve the poor. So, your part in all this is to PRAY for us while we are gone. We don't need your financial support, but we do NEED your prayers. Africa is a dark country and God's light needs to shine brightly there. Pray for God's hedge of protection over us, for our family while we are gone, for the ministry God has placed in front of us while we are in Madagascar, for the people's salvation there, and for the medical care we will be providing. GVBC Cookbooks "Recipes and Remembrances: Nisei Favorites"


