### GATEWAY LEADERSHIP SUMMIT ONE HUNDRED THIRTY-EIGHTH SESSION FIRST SITTING – April 22, 2016

The first sitting of the 138<sup>th</sup> session of the Gateway Annual Conference of the Free Methodist Church of North America convened on Friday, April 22, 2016 at 8:30 a.m. at the Greenville Free Methodist Church in Greenville, IL with Bishop David Kendall presiding.

A time of worship was led by Joel Gropp of the Greenville Free Methodist Church.

Bishop David Kendall's message was entitled "Well and Whole?" and the scripture reading was from John 5:1-9a. Where the Spirit of God is welcomed and obeyed, God works in powerful and life-changing ways. Our anticipation is that God may do something incredible in our day. But do we want that or do we want to get left? Do we want to play the game? The world needs love, true disciples, and wholeness. People live in fear and anxiety. At times the church seems clueless, incapable, or both. It is possible that we don't see that we need help. Do we want to be well? Is that the game we want to play? That is the question Jesus puts to the man. Jesus wants to know if you still have hope or do you just cope? God visits in ways that save and heal. The good news: Jesus comes to us! Jesus' people do what Jesus does. His followers followed – that is the game. He calls them into being with no other thing in mind. We need to learn new ways of being and doing. Work with those to restore or create for the first time capacities they never had or deactivated years ago. How do we know if we need help and healing? Scripture says to be free from arrogance; love is not rude, not easily angered; be gracious and kind; never rejoice in the wrong, but rejoice in what is right and true; speak the truth in love (Matthew 5-7; I Corinthians 13; Colossians 3:1-17; I Peter 1:13-2:10; II Peter 1:1-11). You can never be sure if you don't have a good profile from which to look. Bishop Kendall closed with prayer.

The bar of the conference was established and voting members were urged to be seated.

The conference was called to order by Bishop Kendall.

The model of Jesus is one who lived with the 12 disciples. Real leadership comes from mentoring others by first caring and spending time with them. The church is afraid of failure, but we learn more from failure than success.

ON MOTION from the leadership committee, it was approved by the raising of hands to refer the matter to the MEGA Board for the further development of mentoring and coaching opportunities.

Disciple Deeply – Oliver Beans

Up refers to the love of God; In refers to the love of those inside the church; and UP refers to love of those outside the church. It is not a one size fits all. Insight and context needs to be identified as well as training.

ON MOTION from the discipleship committee, it was approved by the raising of hands that the BOA assign a task force to provide churches insight on best practices for discipleship.

Embrace All – A.J. French

What is missing? Who is missing? What resources do we have within our congregation that we could share with others? What do we need to pursue the path?

ON MOTION from the embrace all committee, it was approved by the raising of hands that each congregation discuss the four questions and in three months submit a report to the BOA.

ON MOTION from the embrace all committee, it was approved by the raising of hands that the MEGA Board oversee and promote a plan regarding women in ministry within the local church.

The conference adjourned for dinner at 5:29 p.m.

The 7:00 evening service opened with worship led by Joel Gropp and team members from other churches including the dance team from MAPS.

Bishop Kendall's message focused on three points. (1) Weeping with Jesus – On The Pastor's (and Church's) Prophetic Role from John 11:1-35. Comparisons were made of the Westboro Baptist Church's responses to those of Jesus. Consider the instances of Jesus' weeping as a tool that the church needs in the 21<sup>st</sup> century. What are the things that move us and concern us, even devastate us to tears? Jesus entered human pain at the death of Lazarus demonstrating He is an agent of hope. He entered into the broken humanity of it all declaring the presence of the resurrection and the life as an agent of grace.

(2) Luke 19:41 – Expressing Prophetic Passion – Jesus was taking a special opportunity to coach the 12 on what it truly meant to be a follower. The crowds gathered at the temple praising Him while the leaders protested. Jesus wept as He approached the city. He wept because they will not receive him nor benefit from his mighty acts of salvation. If there was less trash talking in Jesus' name, maybe there would be more showers of blessing. Maybe our witness would register in

ways it never could otherwise in a world where it seems that anything goes and a terrorist could strike at any time.

(3) Matthew 26 – Making Missional Sacrifice – In the garden of Gethsemane, He became so sorrowful even to the point of death. Luke's gospel says that He sweat drops of blood. It is hard to think he wasn't crying at that moment. We can go with Jesus to places where he weeps and join him in the weeping, and see what He may do as we stand with Him. Those who sow with tears will reap a harvest of joy. What we long to see will just happen. Bishop Kendall closed in prayer.

#### SECOND SITTING - April 23, 2016

The second sitting of the 138<sup>th</sup> session of the Gateway Annual Conference of the Free Methodist Church of North America convened on Saturday, April 23, 2016 at 9:00 a.m. at the Greenville Free Methodist Church in Greenville, IL with Bishop David Kendall presiding.

Superintendent Ben Tolly opened with prayer, and worship was led by Joel Gropp.

Superintendent Ben Tolly presented his State of the Work address emphasizing the theme – Winning God's Way. Phil 2:13 – "for it is God who works in you to will and to act in order to fulfill his good purpose." God is the energy-driver in your life. It is not through will power – that is the recipe for burn out. Cooperation with His Spirit and other believers is what pleases God. It requires improvisation.

Gateway churches need to do four things -(1) move on the obvious; (2) embrace formation; (3) decide faithfully; and (4) over accept. We are called to the tension of our culture being steeped in tradition. We need to be forming a state of trust where people can learn to do things they've never done before

- 1. Move on the obvious Strengthen the Base We can now offer bookkeeping support to church treasurers. Activate the Assets Paul Sunderland provides worship arts support. Pursue the Opportunities Laurel House, Jerseyville satellite, Alton Mission.
- 2. Embrace formation The moment of decision cannot begin a formation; it is based on tradition.
- 3. Decide faithfully Pastors, look for giftedness before sending individuals to the MEGA Board. Develop a leadership plan that is effective. Look back on tradition and hit issues head on keeping the goal in mind.
- 4. Over accept We fit the smaller story and invite others into a larger story; Jesus over accepted the cross and gives hope. There is an over acceptance of difficulty throughout the Bible. We must create a focus of trust to know what God is doing and then over accept with a desire to please him. Over acceptance is walking a pathway with Javier and Glo Quintana and a new church in Honduras.

A connectional nature can be leveraged to move all ministries forward. It will only be achieved by willing people. Are we willing to shake off the things that hinder us from winning God's way?
