Thank you for your interest in the American Youth Leadership Program (AYLP) in Bosnia and Herzegovina! Global Kids is excited to partner with the US State Department's Bureau of Educational and Cultural Affairs to offer this amazing opportunity free of charge to 18 students and 2 adult educators from New York City. Completed applications must be submitted by email to AYLP@globalkids.org no later than 5 pm on January 14, 2013.

Program Overview:

Through AYLP-Bosnia, GK leaders and adult educators will participate in a 10-month program aimed at investigating the role of the media in shaping local and global issues. The program will connect diverse youth from New York City with their peers in Bosnia-Herzegovina in a way that demonstrates the power of peer-to-peer citizen diplomacy, the importance of intercultural understanding, and the influence of the media in conflict, peace-building, and social justice.

Global Kids is partnering with Global Youth Connect, a U.S.-based human rights organization, and the Center for Peacebuilding, an organization that works with young people to nurture trust and mutual understanding in Sanski Most, Bosnia. In collaboration with their Bosnian peers, youth participants will engage in local service-learning activities and conduct social media projects to advance dialogue and community building. Through AYLP-Bosnia, young leaders will develop the skills to become both citizen diplomats and insightful citizen journalists at home and abroad.

Program Timeline:

December 2012: AYLP-Bosnia applications published and recruitment begins

January-February 2013: Applications received; participants interviewed and selected

March-June 2013: Training sessions, workshop development and trip preparation

Late June-July 2013: Three-week exchange to Bosnia (Exact dates to be determined)

August-December 2013: Post-exchange debrief; follow-on projects planned and implemented

Part II: In Person Interview - Once applications have been received, the AYLP-Bosnia selection team will choose a smaller number of applicants to invite to a second round which includes group and one on one interviews. The interviews will take place during the week of January 21, 2013.

Program Eligibility:

All applicants must¹:

- ✓ Be an American Citizen and hold an American passport by March 1, 2013
- ✓ Be a New York City based educator or Global Kids Alumnus

A competitive candidate would have the following qualities:

- A passion for global affairs, human rights and issues related to social justice
- An interest the Balkan region, intercultural understanding and gaining media/journalism skills
- Experience working with young people and knowledge of youth development practice
- Mature, thoughtful and a positive team player; open to new people & places; a happy traveler!

Adult Participant Expectations:

The primary role of the adult participant in the AYLP- Bosnia program is to actively engage in the entire experience alongside student participants. This experience is primarily a professional development opportunity for adult participants, but adults are also expected to serve in the role of mentor and chaperone during the summer exchange. The primary responsibilities of the adult participant are to:

- ✓ Attend program information sessions; participate fully in pre-departure trainings from March 2013-June 2013.
- ✓ Submit all forms and paperwork in a timely matter.
- ✓ Participate in collective fundraising efforts for in-country spending money for students and to expand international opportunities for Global Kids leaders.
- ✓ Actively engage in all aspects of the summer exchange, including workshops, excursions and small group projects.
- ✓ Serve as a mentor and chaperone for 18 students on the program.
- ✓ Be ready and willing to live with a Bosnian host family for 12 nights during the exchange.
- ✓ Upon return, share what was learned with community and carry out action project based on themes and outcomes of exchange in Bosnia.

¹ Applicants are ineligible if: 1) They previously traveled outside the U.S. on any US State Department-funded program within the past three years or have accepted a scholarship for an upcoming U.S. Government-funded exchange program. Should an applicant be accepted for more than one ECA-funded youth program in this timeframe, they must choose only one program in which to participate; and, 2) S/he is a family member (spouse or dependent child) of an employee of the ECA-Youth Programs Division. S/he is a family member (spouse or dependent child) of an employee of Global Kids or project partners of AYLP.
