Lawrence M. Joseph has served on the Global Kids Board of Directors for over 18 years in a variety of roles including as Board Treasurer and as chair of the Finance Committee. He worked for AT&T for 33 years as an attorney specializing in Labor and Employment Law. His work included advising management on a variety of issues, including the negotiation of collective bargaining agreements with the unions representing the company's employees, and on the full scope of the company's equal employment opportunity policies and practices. Prior to his career at AT&T, Mr. Joseph worked in the Appellate Court Litigation section of the National Labor Relations Board in Washington, D.C., defending the Board's orders in the U.S. Courts of Appeal around the Nation. He was a member of the West Side Tennis Club Board of Governors, and President of the Club for four years.

A native New Yorker, Mr. Joseph earned a B.A. at Rutgers University. After serving in the Air Force, where he was deployed to Japan, Mr. Joseph returned to New York City, earning a law degree at Columbia Law School.
