Performance Evaluation in a Context of Uncertainty

Having clearly defined ministry responsibilities can be helpful for ministry contexts that are marked by stability and predictability. However, in many situations, missionaries work in a context of rapid change and instability. Having rigidly defined roles and responsibilities in a context of rapid and profound change can be a handicap rather than a help. If you are working in a context marked by political or economic change, a team that is just starting up or beginning a new ministry focus, you may want to consider using the following chart as a way to approach performance reviews.
