From The Pastor...

I have read the first chapter of John's Gospel again. I am drawn to it this time of year, as we prepare ourselves for Thanksgiving, for Advent, for Christmas, for the New Year. It speaks to the coming of Christ. (I encourage you to open your Bibles and read it again.) And it stirs some thoughts for the Season.

The Christ came into the world as the Word made flesh: What that means is that he came as the expression of the mind of God. Words alone would have failed at the task of describing or revealing God to us; they could not have carried the "Good News." Ordinary languages, even in a multitude of translations, are altogether inadequate, an unfit vessel, for new wine. The mind of God needed more than mere words, so the mighty news was spoken in the incarnation of the Lord. The Word became flesh and dwelt among us – the very expression of God in our midst.

The Christ came into the world as Life: "In him was life." But not a cupful of life, nor even a cup running over. Jesus came as the fountain of life, springing up to satisfy the thirsty soul. And even that thought is inadequate; you have to get behind and below the fountain to its source, its reservoir, its flow. After all, he is the creator of the fountain. "Come to me you who hunger and thirst, and I will give you life..." "like springs of water welling up to eternal life."

The Christ came into the world as Light: "I am the light of the world." Light always overwhelms the darkness, not the other way around. The dark never pushes its way in. Light expels the darkness and reveals – reveals truth and beauty and righteousness. Light shows the detail of a thing, reveals what is truly present, dispels untruth and darkness. And then he infuses his people with light – "You are the light of the world, so don't hide it under a bushel, but like a city on a hilltop, let it shine for the world to see!"

And **the Christ came into the world as Power:** "To them he gave power..." All the power we need for health, wholeness, holiness we find in him. We're talking something far beyond kilowatts and megawatts here. This isn't Hoover Dam or Tesla's battery plant. When the Creator of the universe delivers power, it will realign your world! This is power for a purpose. As John Jowett put it, "Every obligation has its corresponding inspiration, and I am competent to do his will." "You will receive power..." is no empty promise, but an infilling of the Spirit, that our lives may be a witness to the world for him, for his glory, to let his light shine.

I think the most stirring portion of this text from John for me is that Jesus came and "dwelt among us, and we have beheld his glory..." You know how much I love to teach the symbolism of the Tabernacle. The word for "dwelt" used there is related to the Tabernacle of old, a tent pitched right in the middle of the camp, for all to see, where the glory of God "dwelt" in the midst of his people. All the tents of all the tribes are aligned to face the presence of God, the last thing they saw at night; the first thing they saw in the morning, was the Tabernacle. Jesus pitches his tent in order to be the proclamation of God's **Word**; in order to bring **Life** where death reigned; in order to reveal the **Light** of God dispelling darkness, in order to em**power** the foolish and the weak, all of God's people. And all of this he does that we might bear the Word, share his life, and bring light to the world with a power beyond any we might think or imagine.

This is the message of Emmanuel, God with us. He comes to make all things new, new Advent, new Christmas, New Year. May Christ, the Word, the Life, the Light and the Power overwhelmingly bless you in this season, and may you share that blessing with renewed vigor for his kingdom coming, on earth as it is in heaven.

A blessed and holy Christmas and Happy New Year to you all!

Giveaway will be from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. on each of the assigned days. We have increased the hours of service, to help some of the wait time for our clients.

HEALTH MINISTRY CORNER by Donna Zimmerman, RN, Parish Nurse

Leviticus 13: 54 "He shall order that the contaminated article be washed."



The Old Testament laws were very specific in how things should be washed. Today as well, we need to be a bit more specific, especially during cold and flu season to help us stay healthy.

National Hand Washing Awareness Week is December 1-7.

Make sure you are washing your hands the right way to prevent the spread of cold and flu this season. When you see that sign in the restroom with instructions on how to wash your hands, you can't help but roll your eyes, right? It's OK to admit it. We all know the best way to wash our hands and how important this simple act is to helping us stay healthy and avoid disease. At least that's what many people think.

But are you really washing properly? Do you know why you are doing it? What is the recommended amount of time? What's better: hand washing or hand sanitizer? Take a moment to answer the following questions to see if you have all the information necessary to take your health into your own hands this cold and flu season...your clean hands that is.

Hand-washing: what is the best way to wash your hands?

Did you know that a third of Americans don't wash their hands after using the restroom? Rule number one: wash your hands frequently, and **always** after using the restroom. Rub your entire hands vigorously for at least 20 seconds. This includes the backs of your hands and between your fingers. If there's a hand towel available, grab one. The good thing about drying your hands with a clean towel is that you can use the towel to turn off the faucet.

What is the best way to reduce germs?

As simple as it may sound, it still holds true. Washing our hands frequently is one of the best ways to avoid getting sick during flu season and throughout the year. It's also one of the most important steps we can take to keep from spreading germs from one person to another and throughout an entire community. All of the bacteria, viruses and other microbes that we touch on people, surfaces and objects throughout the day accumulate on our hands. When we touch our eyes, nose, or mouth, we end up infecting ourselves with these germs. Washing our hands frequently can seriously limit the transfer of aerms.

Soap vs. Hand Sanitizer

Washing hands with soap and water is the best way to reduce the number of germs on them. It doesn't have to be antibacterial soap, either; any soap will work. As it turns out, antibacterial soap is no more
