Distracted Love

I'm never going to get this article done.

It's Monday afternoon, and here I am sitting at the kitchen table in the vain hope that I might be able to write a newsletter article before dinner.

"Dad, can you fix this for me?"

"I don't understand this homework."

"Can I have some fruit?"

"Honey, do you remember to call your mom about that date in July?"

Around my house, there's always someone who needs a snack or a math problem explained or something fixed. I'll bet I could get a lot more done if I just had one day without all these distractions.

I wonder if Jesus ever thought that.

During most of His ministry, Jesus was hounded by crowds. Like a legion of needy children, they peppered him with questions and asked for favors. One woman even tugged on his robe. But even Jesus needed to get away from all the distractions.

After Herod had John the Baptist executed, Jesus went off by himself. Perhaps he was mourning for His cousin or praying or just trying to find a moment's peace The scriptures don't tell us why he went off by Himself, but they do tell us that his solitude was short-lived. The crowds from all the towns trailed Jesus and invaded his moment of silence.

So on they came, like they always did, wanting this and asking for that. They wanted Jesus to restore their sight and heal their limbs. They wanted to hear Jesus teach and cast out demons. They were hungry and harassed and helpless. They were like sheep without a shepherd.

But Jesus didn't try and hide in the bushes or try and make a quick exit. No, He had *compassion* on them. When he went ashore he saw a great crowd, and he had compassion on them and healed their sick. (Matthew 14:14)

He had compassion on them because they weren't just distractions; they were people, people Jesus came to save.

Quite often what seems like just another distraction is, in reality, a person who is in need of our care. A friend who needs a listening ear, a child who wants to share an apple, the lonely widower at the end of the street, someone who needs a hand unloading a trailer: distractions are inevitable when we love our neighbor, because a distraction is just a need that is important enough to demand our attention. And if we love our neighbor as ourselves, their needs are always important enough to demand our attention.

Christ didn't come to maintain a streamlined calendar or dominate mighty to-do lists. Jesus' ministry was filled with a million interruptions and distractions. But that isn't because He couldn't master the seven habits of highly effective people. Our Lord shows us the true way of servanthood. For the Son of Man did not come to *be* served, but to serve and give His life as a ransom for many. (Mt 20:28)

So now it's Wednesday night, and this article still isn't quite done. But I don't regret reading Dora the Explorer again or the unplanned phone call or the last-minute "pastor, can we talk?" Distractions or not, they were gracious opportunities to serve rather than be served. And every interruption reminds me that our Lord's greater compassion. No matter how many times we lay the same worries at his feet or confess the same sins or come back asking for healing, Jesus still has time for us. He did not turn away the blind man or the widow or the prostitute. And he will not turn away you.

Easter 7 May 8 – John 17:20-26

lesus is praying for you.

Perhaps it's a strange thought, but John 17 is pretty clear: Jesus is praying for you and *all* of His disciples. What's He praying for? He is praying that we would be united in Him, that we would receive his glory, that we would be where He is, and that God's love would be in us.

Divine unity, glory, presence, and love: it's a pretty tall order. The disciples with their confusion and their doubting and their betrayal and their fear seem like they're a long way from what Jesus is praying for. And we can sympathise, because with our fighting and our selfishness and our shame, *our* lives seem like a far cry from all these divine qualities. But thankfully, Jesus isn't telling us to *achieve* these things; He's *praying* that we would have them. We didn't ask for divine unity and love, but Jesus is asking for us. Jesus is asking the Father to *give* these gifts to us, quite apart from our striving.

And Jesus is still praying the same prayer for us today.

Day of Pentecost May 15 – John 14:23-31

"A Miracle of Speaking and Hearing!"

Pentecost is a miracle of words being spoken – words the Holy Spirit brings us from the tongue of Jesus – words Jesus received from the Father. Words are the tool, the weapon, the vehicle, the means of the Holy Spirit. Therefore, the Holy Spirit enters the hearts of people through the ears of people. The Holy Spirit revives our hearts through our ears. He is here as we gather in Jesus name and each Lord's Day in the morning, just as He was on the Sunday morning of the first Pentecost. He is present in your words of witness to the Gospel of Christ to others as God gives you both the opportunity and the Gospel message to speak. And if you think you are an unfit vessel to confess Christ in your daily vocations, it's not about you, but the words of hope and love and life He has given you to speak. The Holy Spirit's office is fulfilled when He points our hearts to what Jesus does and says and gives.

Holy Trinity May 22

Christians don't really believe in God. That is, those sincere folk who say things like, "Well, I'm Christian, you're Buddhist, but the main thing is that we all believe in God," are not quite right. Our God has a face, Jesus; a name, Trinity. Our God comes to us in history, in specific, observable ways that define an agent, an identity. We can't make this God mean anything we like. Trinity Sunday is the church's reminder of the distinctive identity of our God.

2nd Sunday after Pentecost May 29 – Luke 7:1-10

"Worthiness Before God"

The centurion knew two important truths. He knew he was unworthy of Jesus' presence and help. But he also knew and believed that, despite his unworthiness, Jesus could provide everything he needed with a mere word. But say the word, and let my servant be healed." All that the centurion wanted was a simple word. He knew from his life's vocation that he could issue a simple command, and the men under him would carry it out. How much more could God incarnate issue a simple word, and since everything is under the authority of God, that simple word would be as good as done. Jesus didn't need to come personally. He just needed to come in the power of a simple word.

If there's ever a lesson we need to remember from the Word of God, it is that we are not worthy of His grace. That's not exactly a popular lesson to learn, but like many life lessons, the most important lessons aren't always the easiest ones to hear. But when the reality of our unworthiness strikes our souls, we can truly appreciate this greater reality: Despite our unworthiness, Jesus comes to us in His Word and by a messenger says, "I... Almighty, Perfect, Holy, Righteous God- forgive you and love you. That's a lesson worth remembering, now and forever! Amen




Dear Freinds at \$100,
