Preparing for 2018

I know we are a few months away from 2018 but in the rhythms of church life, now is the season to begin planning and preparing for the year ahead and all that God has in store for us. I have been reflecting on the year ahead, and want to invite you to consider that we set aside 2018 as a year for celebration and Sabbath (rest); celebrating our journey to date as a Parish. A year of sabbath rest as we ask God to fill us afresh and refocus us on the work he has planned for us.

What does this mean practically? I would like for us to simplify 2018 by focussing our energies on strengthening our Sunday celebrations (worship), building up our small groups (discipleship and fellowship), and re-developing our structures and systems (administration) so that we are prepared to 're-launch' ourselves in 2019 with renewed vigour as we seek to reach the northern end of the Gold Coast in Jesus name.

Over the last few weeks a number of people have asked about what the above means. Does it mean that we will be cancelling events and activities? The short answer is no. Anything new we do will need to have prayerful consideration. Anything we are currently doing, if people are willing to continue them, will do so. I hope that this helps to clarify things.
