### The Community I See... The Church I See...

There was something about Jesus that drew people to him but repelled others. The people who were repelled tended to be more self-reliant, self-righteous and self-entitled. They had no need of Jesus.

In our Bible reading from the book of Mark, we see account of many people coming to Jesus to be healed. There are other accounts of large crowds coming to be fed, and to listen to Jesus' teaching. They were desperate for wholeness, meaning and direction.

I see a church that will passionately, sacrificially, courageously step into our community to serve and bless the community in Jesus name. I see a church that help people connect to Jesus so that they too may find hope, healing, and forgiveness.
