



Country in Focus:



Henan Province, China (1)

Henan Province, with a population of nearly 100 mil-

lion, is located along the Yellow River in north-central China. More than 70 percent of the population ekes out a living by farming small plots. Frequent flooding has led to widespread destruction and loss of life, and Mao's disastrous policies caused more than eight million Henanese to die of starvation.

Christians make up about 20 percent of the province's population. Henan was declared an "atheistic zone" in the 1960s but has since become a driving force of the Christian church in China.

Prayer concerns:

- •The persecution of Christians in Henan Province is still prevalent and often severe.
- Pseudo-Christian cults are flourishing in Henan.
- •The mostly rural church network struggles with migration of workers and urbanization problems.
- Selective abortion, child abandonment, and infanticide occur with regularity.

Chinese Church Protests Arrest of Members (1)

A church in eastern China has written a letter to the Chinese government demanding permission to stage a protest against the detention of 23 members of its congregation.

The Nanle County Church in Puyang, Henan Province, which comes under the state-sanctioned Three-Self Patriotic Movement, claims the majority of those detained, including the church's leader, Fan Ruiling, "have not received a criminal charge, nor any written notice, nor have their families been told where they are detained." The church says the whereabouts of four other arrested church leaders are "unknown and no one knows whether they are alive or dead."

Communist authorities have often clashed with members of unofficial or "house" churches, with demolitions of houses of worship and beatings of parishioners not unknown. But it is unusual for authorities to crack down on a state-sanctioned church.

Fact-Checking Sermons

According to Barna Group research, four in ten churchgoing Millennials fact-check their pastors' sermons online, often during the service, using their smartphones. Seven of ten also report reading Scripture online.

A Most Costly Book (2)

A copy of the *Bay Psalm Book*, the first book published in America, was recently auctioned off by Sotheby's. The book was expected to bring between \$15 and \$20 million but sold for \$14.1 million. One of two copies owned by Old South Church in Boston, it is one of only 11 remaining copies in existence. The proceeds of the auction will be used to help replenish Old South's endowment once \$7 million is used for deferred maintenance. The church historian resigned over the decision to sell one of the church's treasures, but the rest of the congregation overwhelmingly supported the sale.



Church in a Pub (2)

Recently, the regional council of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America approved "Church-in-a-Pub" in Fort Worth, Texas, as a synod-authorized worshiping community. The church, whose official name is Kyrie, meets in a local alehouse every Sunday night. "I'm not interested, frankly, in making more church members," Pastor Philip Heinze said. "I'm interested in having people have significant relationships around Jesus. And if it turns out to be [over] craft beer, fine."

First African Woman Elected to High World Council Post (3)

Dr. Agnes Abuom, an Anglican church leader from Kenya who has served multiple religious posts in Africa, made ecumenical history when she was elected as the new moderator of the World Council of Churches' highest governing body. She is the first woman and the first African chosen to head the 150-member Central Committee.

This month you can... Talk to an Atheist

All too often churches exist in a bubble and keep those who profess to have no faith outside. But the Fixed Point Foundation is working to change that dynamic. The organization's mission is to seek innovative ways to defend and proclaim the gospel and to prepare Christians to do the same. "Whether it is our traditional concepts of human dignity and purpose or our understanding of what constitutes right

and wrong, Christianity has served as the primary source of inspiration, giving light to law, government, the arts and sciences—indeed, giving light to what Dostoevsky called, 'The Eternal Questions,'" the foundation's mission statement explains. Fixed Point seeks to be an expression of the church speaking into the culture, challenging the unbelief of skeptics and restoring the Christian's confidence that the Bible is precisely

The Fixed Point Foundation was established in 2001 and has sponsored highly publicized events at universities ranging from Oxford to the University of North Carolina. Its resources are being used in universities, schools, and churches around the world.

Dutch Bishops Paint Picture of Catholic Church in Decline (4)

Dutch bishops visiting Rome have given Pope Francis a dramatic snapshot of the steep decline of Roman Catholicism in the European heartland. Both Catholic and Protestant Christian ranks have shrunk dramatically in Europe over the last several decades, and hundreds of churches have been sold and converted to other uses.

In the Netherlands, churches have been closing at the rate of one or two a week. The bishops reported that about two-thirds of all Roman Catholic churches in the Netherlands would have to be shut or sold by 2025 and many parishes merged because congregations and finances were "in a long-term shrinking process."

Evangelicals in Austria: Large Enough to Be Legal (5)

More than 150 churches in Austria once viewed as cults are now an official faith—at least in the eyes of their government. The new legal status of evangelicals—and the resulting educational and tax benefits—comes after five denominations joined forces in order to meet the Central European nation's minimum size requirements. Pastors hope it will boost their legitimacy in the eyes

of their predominately Catholic neighbors. Another benefit: the churches will no longer be breaking labor laws when their pastors preach on Sunday.



British Government: Prosecuting SexSelection Abortions Not in the Public Interest (6)

The battle over sex-selection abortion in Great Britain continues unabated after the health minister sent a letter to doctors saying "urgent" guidelines will be issued following the decision of the Crown Prosecution Service (CPS) not to prosecute two abortionists who were willing to abort female babies. The CPS said that although there was enough evidence to prosecute the doctors, it would not be "in the best interests" of the public to do so. This conclusion followed a 19-month investigation spurred by the undercover work of the Daily Telegraph, which demonstrated beyond dispute that there are abortionists in England who will abort a child because the mother says she does not want a girl.

UK Parliament Told Christianity Is "Most Persecuted Religion" (6)

The plight of Christians around the world was discussed in the Houses of Parliament in London. Members of the House of Commons were told that the persecution of Christians is increasing, that one Christian is killed about every 11 minutes around the world, and that Christianity is the "most persecuted religion globally." A list of countries in which life as a Christian is most difficult includes Syria, North Korea, Eritrea, Nigeria, Iraq, and Egypt.



MP Jim Shannon alleged that 200 million Christians will be persecuted for their faith this year, while 500 million live in "dangerous neighborhoods."

MP Sammy Wilson said, "Within the last month, hundreds of people, from Nigeria to Eritrea to Kazakhstan to China, have been arrested and put in prison simply because of their faith, and when they go into prison they are denied due process. They are denied access to lawyers. They are sometimes even denied knowledge of the charges facing them. They can languish in prison for a long

time and in horrible conditions. This is not only happening in Muslim countries. From Morocco to Pakistan, Christians in Muslim countries are under threat, but it happens elsewhere too."

Christian Church Growing Rapidly in India (7)

Ministries in India are reporting significant growth in the Christian church among middle and upper caste Indians and the younger Indian generations.

Long recognized as one of the most diverse nations in the world, India is currently the second most populous nation on earth, with over 1.2 billion residents. Experts predict that India will soon eclipse China as the world's most populous country.

According to Operation World, 74 percent of India's populace identify as Hindu, 14 percent describe themselves as Muslim, and 6 percent are Christian. However, with an annual growth rate of nearly 4 percent, Christianity is by far the fastest growing of all major religions in India. Traditionally, Christianity has largely been limited to lower castes in India, so the spread of the gospel across other cultural boundaries has been encouraging to missions groups.

"With more than 71 million claiming Christianity, India is now the eighth largest Christian nation in the world," Dick McClain, president and CEO of the Mission Society, explained. "Yet with 456 languages and more than 2,611 distinct people groups, India still has more people groups unreached with the gospel than any other nation."
