This Week in Church History...

On December 16, 1714, George Whitefield, English revivalist, was born in Gloucester, England. He met the Wesley brothers at Oxford in 1732, experienced the new birth in 1735 and embarked on his lifelong calling as an evangelist. He usually preached outdoors, to crowds as large as 20,000. He first sailed to America in 1738, where he founded an orphanage near Savannah, Georgia. During the years 1741-43, he broke with the Wesleys over the doctrines of free grace and predestination. Whitefield visited America seven times and died at Newburyport, Massachusetts, on September 30, 1770.

Focus on: Bangladesh (1)

Bangladesh is one of the vorld's poorest countries. suffering from gross overpoplation and periodic natural disasters, such as devastating floods and cyclones, often accompanied by enormous loss of life and property. Poverty is endemic and seemngly impossible to overcome, although some progress is being made. Major ncome comes from agriculture, texiles, clothing, and funds sent home by emigrants. Nearly half the population of 65 million lives on less than one dollar a day. Thousands of nongovernmental agencies and relief organizations are relping in this economic struggle, with nicro-credit operations leading the vay.

Pray for:

- Education and renewed economic nvestment and development to help preak the cycle of poverty;
- The huge people group of Bengalis, numbering 240 million worldwide and epresenting one of the largest uneached groups in the world.
- A path to religious tolerance between Muslims, Christians, and people of other faiths.

Philippines' Catholic Bishops Vow to Counter Islamic State (2)

Leaders of the Philippine Roman Catholic Church have vowed to counter extremist religions such as that espoused by Islamic State militants in Syria and Iraq.

Archbishop Socrates Villegas, who heads the Catholic Bishops Conference of the Philippines, also asked the country's bishops to collect donations for Christians who have been displaced by the militants and whose places of worship have been razed "by a godless rage with which no genuine religion can ever identify."

Citing brutal actions by the Islamic State group, including the beheading of American journalist James Foley, Villegas said the Philippine Catholic church will "do our part . . . to counter the defacement of religion."

Villegas went on to say that "those who kill and slaughter, wound and maim, destroy and burn in the name of God send the world the awful message that religion divides, that faith is oppressive, that belief can engender so much unkindness."

Australia: Government Will Fund School Chaplains (3)

Chaplains in Australian schools are to continue receiving money from the federal government, despite a High Court

decision that put their funding under threat.

The court ruled that it was against the constitution for national funding to go directly to chaplaincy organizations. But the federal government is now providing individual states and territories with money in order for them to administer the National School Chaplaincy Program.

Scott Ryan, parliamentary secretary to the minister for education, said, "The Government believes that school chaplains make a valuable contribution to the wellbeing of students and school communities."

Nuns Attacked in Bangladesh (1)

Dozens of armed men broke into a convent in northern Bangladesh, beating a group of nuns at a small mission. "The attack was massive and lasted about an hour and a half. The attackers brutally beat the nuns. The convent was seriously devastated," Bishop Sebastian Tudu of Dinajpur said. "Only when the police arrived did the attackers

leave the mission." The rectory, convent, and hospital were all objects of the attack carried out by between 50 and 60 men.

While Christians have been attacked before in the Muslim-majority nation, this is the first time that nuns have been targeted. "It's unprecedented because nuns are highly respected in Bangladesh," Bishop Tudu said. "The attack is obviously a targeted and planned attempt at intimidation. Nuns and priests are being attacked because they stand up for the disadvantaged and minorities."

Pastor Arrested in Chinese Crackdown on Christian Community (4)

A Christian pastor in eastern China who has been openly critical of a church demolition campaign is facing a sentence of 10 years in prison. Pastor Huang Yizi was taken from his home by plainclothes police officers and faces what his supporters call a "trumped-up charge." His lawyers say the allegation of "gathering to assault a state

The following is another success story, submitted by a church in Maryland.

"I'm Jonathan Batchelder, senior pastor of the Fawn Grove Church of the Nazarene in Pylesville, MD. We heard that this activity had been done by another church, so we decided to do the same thing and serve our local community. It's simple: we pick up trash at the local fair that benefits our volunteer fire department. It started out

as simply picking up trash off the ground and placing it into the barrels around the fairgrounds, but the past two years it has grown a bit so that we now drive around the fairgrounds several times each day collecting the trash barrels, taking them to the Dumpster to empty them, and then returning them to their locations. This is something we do to serve both Christ and our community."

organ" is often used by Chinese authorities to silence critics of the government.

Huang's detention follows bloody clashes between security agents using cattle prods against Christians who were resisting the removal of a cross from their church. The Chinese authorities have been targeting the country's Christian community, which is growing rapidly, and their crackdown has seen the demolition of some 200 churches.

School District Replaces Chaplains with "Life Coaches" (5)

A Florida school district has decided to replace its use of local pastors as high school football chaplains with the position of "life coaches" following a complaint from a prominent atheist organization.

The Madison, Wisconsin-based Freedom from Religion Foundation (FFRF) sent a letter to the Orange County Public School District's attorney this past March, stating that its use of pastors as chaplains amounts to "illegal religious activity."

"It is inappropriate and unconstitutional for the district to offer a Christian minister unique access to befriend and proselytize student athletes," the letter states, referring to reports that Todd Lamphere, pastor of The Venue Church in Apopka, Florida, has been serving as chaplain of the Apopka High School football team. "Accordingly, public high school football teams cannot appoint or employ a chaplain, seek out a spiritual leader for the team, or agree to have a volunteer chaplain, because public schools may not advance or promote religion."

In response, the school district's attorney sent a memo to the superintendent and others, advising that it is unlawful for Lamphere or others to serve as chaplains. While FFRF considers the memo a victory, pastors in the



area are appalled by what they view as a form of eradication of Christianity from public life.

"They said I could still come and speak, but I wasn't going to be called a chaplain; they wanted to call me a 'life coach,'" Troy Schmidt, pastor of First Baptist Church of Windermere and chaplain at Olympia High School, said. "I could no longer open the Bible, talk about the Bible, talk about God, or pray with the team in any capacity. It was heartbreaking."

Schmidt said that he rejects the new title and will continue to take a stand in whatever way he can. In the meantime, he said that his church will continue serving free meals to the Olympia High School football team.

Report: Almost Half of Syrian Population Now Displaced (6)

According to a devastating new UN report, nearly half of all Syrians have been displaced by the violence of the country's ongoing civil war. As many as 6.5 million who have fled their homes are displaced within the country, and at least 3 million Syrians have left the country altogether. The UN High Commissioner for Refugees said in a statement, "The Syrian crisis has become the biggest humanitarian emergency of our era, yet the world is failing to meet the needs of refugees and the countries hosting them."



The report, which is attempting to bring greater international awareness and intervention to the crisis, also outlined the dangers facing even those who are fleeing the war. "There are worrying signs too that the journey out of Syria is becoming tougher, with many people forced to pay bribes at armed

checkpoints proliferating along the borders. Refugees crossing the desert into eastern Jordan are being forced to pay smugglers hefty sums (ranging from \$100 per person or more) to take them to safety."

Judge Finds Polygamy Law Unconstitutional (5)

A federal judge finalized the order striking part of Utah's bigamy law, and the long legal battle over polygamy in Utah now appears headed to the appeals courts. Utah Attorney General Sean Reyes has said he would appeal a federal court ruling that found the law against polygamy unconstitutional.

Last December, federal judge Clark Waddoups struck the section of Utah's bigamy statute that can be applied when someone "cohabits with another person" to whom they are not legally married. Utah law made such a union a felony punishable by up to five years in prison. Waddoups said the ban violated the 1st and 14th amendments to the Constitution.

Waddoups let stand the portion of the statute that prevents someone from having more than one active marriage license.
