This Week in Church History...

On October 21, 1970, John T. Scopes (b.ca. 1900), Tennessee high school biology teacher, died. In 1925, he went to trial for violating the Butler Act, which prohibited the teaching of evolution in Tennessee schools. William Jennings Bryan was prosecuting attorney and Clarence Darrow defended Scopes. The overblown publicity of the case gave rise to its popular nickname, "The Scopes Monkey Trial." Scopes was found guilty and fined \$100, but the decision was later overturned by the Tennessee Supreme Court. (Scopes went on to graduate studies at the University of Chicago and became a geologist.)
