SHARING THE GOOD THINGS HAPPENING IN THE LIFE OF OUR CHURCH

"Am I My Brother's Keeper?"

After the "Fall of Man" (recorded in Genesis chapter 3), it seemed inevitable that murder would ensue. In Genesis chapter 4:7, God warned Cain that "sin was crouching at the door; and its desire is for you, but you must master it." Continuing in verse 9 we read: "Then the Lord said to Cain, 'Where is Abel your brother?' And he said, 'I do not know. Am I my brother's keeper?" And God said, "What have you done? The voice of your brother's blood is crying to me from the ground" [Genesis 4:10].

And, of course, we all know the answer to the question: "Am I my brother's keeper?" In "Qur Daily Bread" for Friday, August 2 the storyline makes mention of 2 Corinthians 1:3-7 and especially verse 7 where it says: "and our hope for you is firmly grounded, knowing that as you are sharers of our sufferings, so also you are sharers of our comfort."

From this daily devotional the writer begins by saying, where noticed through the years that those who have suffered are quick to comfort other sufferers.+He goes on to say, which and again we see the body of Christ supporting and encouraging one another. These Christians have learned that they can use the trials they we been through to reach out to others going through similar difficulties.+

As your under-shepherd for these twelve years, I am continually amazed and gratified as to the ways the people of Grace Community Church reach out to one another; both in difficult times as well as in times of rejoicing! Yes, even when many of our members are away for extended periods of time. Let me cite just two examples. Henry Wilson was recently diagnosed with pancreatic cancer (stage 3). But Henry and his wife, Barbara, are not facing this dire situation alone. Through the church "Phone Tree", news of Henry condition was passed on to others in the church. Prayers are being offered on his behalf on a daily basis. Then, too, Anne Bakos, at her home in Rochester, MI, was recently diagnosed with another form of cancer; although her surgeon suspected that the mass was possibly benign. Once again, prayers went out on her behalf. And like so many times before, God was quick to answer the prayers of the righteous! Although Anne still had to undergo surgery, the growth was benign. And for this we give our thanks and praise to God!

I am reminded of the words of James, the half-brother of our Lord Jesus, who wrote: "Is anyone among you suffering? Let him pray. Is anyone cheerful? Let him sing praises. Is anyone among you sick? Let him call for the elders of the church, and let them pray over him, anointing him with oil in the Name of the Lord; and the prayer offered in faith will restore the one who is sick, and the Lord will raise him up,...The effective prayer of a righteous man can accomplish much" [James 5:13-16].

The writer of this storyline from "Our Daily Bread" closed with these words: "May we never leave someone to suffer alone. If we know the trail another is on, God will help us to guide that person to his presence-the surest comfort of all.+And then this "title gem of wisdom+appeared at the bottom of the page: "God comforts us so that we can comfort others!"

To the people of Grace, I commend you for continuing to extend brotherly love to those who are in need. Keep doing what you have always done and give thanks to God in all thingso now and always!
