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### Church FAQs:


1. What is the vision of Grace Life Community Church (GLCC)?
  - Choosing the Life God always intended.
2. What are GLCC's core values?
  - A dynamic, personal relationship with God through Jesus Christ.
  - Authentic, loving community.
  - A relevant, transformational message of grace and truth.
  - The expansion of God's Kingdom globally.
  - Loving God and loving people.
3. What are GLCC's strategies?
  - Guide people from death to life.
  - Guide people from brokenness to wholeness.
  - Guide people from the bondage of walking after the flesh to the freedom of walking in the Spirit.
  - Guide people from isolation or unhealthy community into healthy community.
  - Guide people from a performance based to an identity based relationship with God.
4. What denomination is GLCC?
  - Our church has no denominational affiliation. We are an independent evangelical church of the Baptist tradition. Because we are an independent church, we have no reporting authority outside our own congregation nor do financial contributions go to sustain a denominational hierarchy. Our church is free to voluntarily associate with other churches and organizations for joint ministry and fellowship. You can find out more about this in Discover GLCC class.

## FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS(FAQs)

### 5. What governance structure is in place at the church?

- We have a Board of Directors, Associate Pastors, Deacons, Elders, and an Administrative staff. We also have a finance committee that reports to the Treasurer who sits on the Board of Directors and a standing nominations committee responsible for identifying qualified church members to fill many of these positions. The Deacons are responsible for congregational care. The Elders are focused on spiritual direction. All budgets are approved by the church body by a vote in accordance with the church Bylaws (available from the church office). The Deacons Chair, Elder Chair, and Board Member are voted on by church members. When elected, Board Members serve staggered terms of 1-3 yrs. They can serve 2 consecutive terms of 3 yrs. and then must take a year off per the Bylaws

### 6. How do I find out the history of GLCC?

- The best way to learn about when our church was formed and how God has grown our church is to attend the Discover GLCC class.

### 7. Where do I find the beliefs, doctrine, or bylaws of GLCC?

- The church has a Constitution that explains our core beliefs, our governance structure, and our organization. All attendees to the Discover GLCC class receive a copy. The Constitution is also available from the church office.

## FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS(FAQs)

### 8. Are the Pastors ordained ministers? Is this recognized by other churches?

- Though not a requirement set forth by our church constitution, all of our Pastors are ordained. Yes, this ordination is recognized by churches of like faith and practice.

### 9. How do I talk with a Pastor or a Deacon?

- While you will find our Pastors and Deacons to be very approachable, if you have something to discuss that requires their undivided attention we suggest you make an appointment. You can email the Pastors directly, or call the church office. You can make an appointment directly with Deacons to meet in person or over the phone. If you are wondering who your Deacon is, you can call the office or if you are in a Connect Group, you can ask your Connect Group leader.

### 10. How do I find out the Pastors' contact information?

- Contact information is available in our weekly church bulletin, as well as on the website ([www.gracelifecc.org](http://www.gracelifecc.org)) – simply click “Home”, “staff” and then click the photo to send an email. Please feel free to call the church office to speak with one of them or to set-up an appointment (571-229-1700).

### 11. How can I request the support of Pastor or a Deacon at an event?

- We encourage you to fill out a Response Card located in the back of the pews and place it in the offering box. You may also call the church office.

### 12. Where do I find the beliefs, doctrine, or bylaws of GLCC?

- The church has Bylaws that explains our core beliefs, our governance structure, and our organization. All attendees to Discover GLCC class receive a copy. The Bylaws are also available from the church office.

### 13. What is the role of a Deacon? What do they do?

- The Deacons are Spirit-filled men elected to care for the temporal affairs of the church, (Acts 6) but may also be called upon for spiritual ministry and leadership as God so equips (Acts 6,8). As such, the Deacons serve under the Pastor(s) of the church for the congregation to provide the following:
  - Support the pastor(s) by providing counsel, prayer, and spirit-led ethical, moral and spiritual accountability. (1 Timothy 5:1, 19-20).
  - Promote the spiritual welfare of the church by aiding the pastor(s) in providing shepherding oversight of the congregation.
  - Assist the Pastor in executing membership discipline as prescribed by the constitution.
  - Provide recommendations to the church regarding all agenda items brought at duly-called business meetings.
  - Assist the Pastor(s) in the administering of the ordinances.
  - Provide leadership and continuity in the event the pastoral staff is unavailable or the office of pastor is vacant.

## FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS(FAQs)

### 14. How are Deacons assigned to ministries and connect groups?

- Deacons are assigned to support ministries and connect groups through the prayerful and God-led consideration of the Pastors and Deacons. Because Deacons are assigned to represent you and serve you primarily via Connect Groups, we encourage you to join these important groups in order to facilitate the meeting of your spiritual needs. However, if you have not “declared” a Connect Group or are not a member of any particular Connect Group, then upon church membership a Deacon will be assigned. Individuals may also request their name be added to Deacon Care lists based upon the ministries they are involved with or through another connection to GLCC outside of Connect Groups.

## Service/Sermon/Communion FAQs

### 15. What are the service times and what is being offered at these times?

- **9:30am:** Worship Service (with sign language interpretation), Sunday School (2 years old through 5th grade) and Nursery.
- **11:00am:** Adult Connect Groups and Discipleship Classes, Junior Church (Preschool - 5th Grade), Youth Sunday School, and Nursery.

### 16. What is the format for the 9:30am service?

- The format of Sunday morning worship services consists of time for worship and a message. The sermon is projected on the flat screen TV in the Comfort Suite (Rm. 138) to make it possible for parents with unsettled children to benefit from the sermon.

### 17. How is the offering taken?

- We believe that giving to God’s kingdom should be done with a cheerful heart. We do not believe in pressuring you into giving or asking you repeatedly for your financial contribution. For this reason, we do not pass an offering plate, but have wooden offering boxes located at each exit for your convenience to place the offering the Lord leads you to give as you exit the auditorium. We also have the capability to receive your financial contributions through online giving at our website ([www.gracelifecc.org](http://www.gracelifecc.org)). The financial needs of GLCC are printed in the bulletin each week. Our programs are designed to give back and glorify God’s kingdom. And we have much kingdom work to do! Your offering will help us identify and serve the needs of people in need of hearing the truth of God’s grace, love, and desires for them. We do hope you will prayerfully consider what God’s desire is for you in supporting our mission financially.

## FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS(FAQs)

### 18. How do I keep up with all the activities at the church?

- Because the primary purpose of our service is to turn our focus on God, we try not to interrupt our worship services with excessive announcements regarding church activities. On occasion, we may make a verbal announcement at the beginning or end of a worship service. Before and after the services, we often run a series of announcement slides in the auditorium and these announcements are also projected on flat screen TVs in the lobby. In addition, ushers provide a weekly church bulletin that highlights upcoming activities and other news about community life, and the church provides a weekly eNewsletter. If you would like to receive the eNewsletter, you may sign-up by contacting the church office.

### 19. Does GLCC practice communion?

- Yes. Communion is usually held the first Sunday of each month. We practice an open communion with wafer and juice, as well as bread and juice elements. During a communion service there are several stations in the auditorium. Sometimes church leadership will serve you communion and sometimes the stations will be self-serve. At most communion services, both options of tearing a piece of bread from a loaf and dipping it in a chalice of grape juice, as well as individual bread and cup are available. Communion is designed to be an unhurried time for reflection and celebration for the entire church family. Various ministries and small groups may also observe communion within their own small group community.

### 20. What elements does the church use for Communion?

- The Bible indicates that the elements used to symbolize Christ's suffering are "bread" (Luke 22:19) and "the fruit of the vine" (Luke 22:18). In the spirit of the Last Supper, we commemorate the Lord's Supper with unleavened bread and unfermented grape juice.

### 21. Why don't we call Communion a sacrament?

- As we understand scripture, the Lord's Supper is commemorative in nature. As such, it is a powerful means of drawing us close to God and fostering spiritual growth in our lives. It serves to publicly illustrate core spiritual realities that have the ability to transform our daily living. However, we do not believe that Communion in any way bestows saving grace or is related to our salvation experience.

### 22. Do I have to be a member to participate in Communion?

- No. We understand from scripture that the only requisites for participating in the Lord's Supper are salvation and a heart to walk with God. Each individual is instructed towards self-examination and confession before communion.

### 23. Should I allow my children to participate in Communion?

- This is a decision to be made between you and your child. We would suggest that if your child has made a commitment to Christ, has followed Christ in believer's baptism, and is seeking to walk with God, they may participate in Communion.

## FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS(FAQs)

### 24. What kind of music is played on a regular basis?

- We strive for blended worship services. However, our primary focus is on God's message as it is laid on the heart of the person preaching that week. As a result, the music and visual effects utilized in both services are an attempt to align the message with the way people best experience God's word. Because people have different "spiritual pathways", we prefer to use a variety of methods to connect with as many people as possible.

### 25. Why are there people "coming and going" during the worship service?

- We start the service promptly. Sometimes people cannot make it here in time. Sometimes during the service, we have a drama or a baptism. This requires people to move forward while others are speaking-- we ask for understanding. As we are nearing the close of the service, volunteers and leaders may need to prepare something ahead of you and/or your children's arrival for connect group and children's activities hour. As a result, they will leave the auditorium a few minutes early--we ask for your understanding.

### 26. Why do the Pastors sometimes invite people to come forward at the end of the service?

- Sometimes it's important for our Pastors to provide a time in the service for you to answer God's calling as He speaks to you. This may be done by coming up to the front of the auditorium or you may choose to go to the Next Step Suite located at the back of the auditorium after the service. The Next Step Suite is staff with volunteers to pray with you or provide you with information.

### 27. Is there a place where I can pray or have quiet time to rest with the Lord?

- Yes, the Next Step Suite has several small rooms in which you may use to pray in either by yourself or with one of our Next Step volunteers.

### 28. When is the GLCC Café open?

- The GLCC café is open on Sundays from 10:15am – 11:15am. (*Please do not take coffee or food into the auditorium.*)

## Membership FAQs:

### 29. What are the requirements for joining the church?

- To join our church as a member, you must meet the following membership requirements:
  - Salvation: The most important relationship in anybody's life is their relationship with Christ. The greatest decision anyone can make is to accept Him as your personal Savior.
  - Believer's Baptism: This is a very special event in the life of the believer as you publicly demonstrate your desire to follow Christ and be identified with His church. However, in many churches, the method and the timing differ. We practice believer's baptism by immersion. In other words, we believe that one is baptized by immersion after he/she professes faith in Christ and this is a requirement for membership. If you are coming from the similar tradition as stated above, we do not ask you to be baptized again. If

you are coming from a tradition that differs, we do ask that you be baptized. Note: if you were baptized in this manner by another church, you may transfer to GLCC with a letter.

- Declaration of Faith: As a believer, we ask that you share your testimony with a Pastor. You may do so by setting up a time with one of them.
- Note: It is also highly recommended that individuals attend the “Discover GLCC” class to familiarize themselves with GLCC. However, attending these classes is not required for membership.

### 30. What is expected of members who join the church?

- Members should “feel willingly led by the Holy Spirit to unite with the GLCC church family. In doing so, members commit themselves to God and to the other members to do the following:
  - too allow God to use my church.
  - too protect the unity of my church.
  - too share the responsibility of my church.
  - too will serve the ministry of my church.

### 31. What is the membership process, step-by-step?

- Future members who have reviewed the purpose, mission, and beliefs of the church (customarily by attending the Discover GLCC class), should:
  - Fill out an intake form (available in the church office, or in Discover GLCC). The intake form helps the staff to “Get to Know You”. Bring the form with you to your 1-on-1 meeting (below).
  - Someone will contact you to schedule a 1-on-1 meeting with a Pastor or Pastor-appointed individual to discuss brief questions about your spiritual journey, baptism, and your understanding of our doctrinal beliefs found in the church covenant. Couples may attend this meeting together. If you have a child that wants to officially join, the child should also participate in the meeting with you.
  - With the Pastor’s (or Pastor appointed Individual’s) approval, you will be scheduled to stand in front of the church body following a Sunday morning worship service for membership approval and the seated members in the congregation will give their response thereby voting you into membership.
  - That’s it! You will then be a member of the GLCC church family. You’ll be added to the official church roster. This means we can send letters of transfer to other churches, include you on membership mailings, and count you as a “voting member” for Bylaw purposes.

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### 32. How important is it to join, really?

- The benefits of becoming a member at Grace Life Community Church are numerous. When you become a member at GLCC, you become formally identified with a spiritual family who will support and encourage you in your walk with Christ. You will have a place where you can discover and fully use your spiritual gifts in ministry. You will receive the spiritual guidance and accountability you need to grow. Furthermore, members of Grace Life Community Church are allowed to vote in church business meetings and may be considered for various ministry opportunities and leadership positions which are not available to non-members.

### 33. Once I join, what do I do next?

- Once you join, we encourage you to plug into the programs, ministries, and connect groups that we have to offer that most align with your spiritual gifts. We do not desire that anyone become over-committed or over-serving. You ALWAYS have the freedom to say no. Find a ministry that really resonates with your gifting and pour your ministry energy into it. When we're operating from our giftedness, our service is joyful and without burden. It's also our desire that we can help you Connect, Grow, and Serve God and others wherever you are in your spiritual journey!

### 34. What happens in the church business meetings? Do I have to go?

- All are welcome at our Church business meetings; however, only members are allowed to vote. In these important meetings, we worship, celebrate what God is doing, and discuss the budget, staffing, other administrative issues concerning the church. Many of the final decisions rest with the voting church membership per the church's Bylaw's. In these meetings, the Pastors often share a fresh vision for our church community. As a result, it's important that members come to these important meetings, though attendance is usually not taken.

## Connect Group FAQs:

### 35. What is the Discover GLCC Class?

- Discover GLCC is 2-week structured format followed by a group discussion format. The class is designed to help you: a) discover our foundations; b) discover our vision; and c) discover our beliefs. As part of this class, we encourage you to participate in the Discover GLCC group to help you experience connection (connect group info, other ways to connect), experience growth (programs and ministries, membership process), and experience service (spiritual gift(s), volunteering, other ways to serve).
- We recommend all visitors and new members attend Discover GLCC at least one time (though you can attend more if you wish). Anyone wishing to connect or reconnect with GLCC should attend the Discover GLCC class. It is set-up for you to attend as many times as you wish to gain new information about current church events, discuss connecting, growing, and giving, as well as staying up-to-date on current volunteer openings, etc.

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### 36. What are Connect Groups?

- Connect groups provide opportunities for reflection, discussion, prayer and fellowship. Equally as important, the Connect Group forum provides the regular opportunity for supporting your spiritual journey. We not only use the connect groups to assign Deacons, but we also rely on connect groups to provide pastoral care. Being in a small group setting allows you to "connect with the message" on a personal level while "connecting with one another". In this way, the connect groups provide you with a community of believers that can help you, support your spiritual walk, and provide a "family-like" support network and spiritual network.

### 37. How do I declare my intention to join a specific connect group?

- You may visit any connect group you wish. We understand that finding a connect group that fits your personal style, spiritual walk, and personality may require some time. We encourage you to try out several connect groups until you find one that is a great fit. It might be the first you try or the 4<sup>th</sup>, but stick with it! Seek God's direction for which group would best suit you on your journey with Him. When you have decided to stay in one connect group, you will need to tell the Connect Group leader that you "wish to join the connect group" or "be added to the connect group roster". The Connect Group leader will then add you to his/her roster.

### 38. What happens (specifically) in connect groups?

- In connect groups, announcements are made, introductions occur, and your personal needs are better understood. The group will use a guided discussion format to share and dialogue about the message from the sermon. Each Connect Group Leader serves as "shepherd" by helping you understand where you are in your spiritual journey and prayerfully recommending options for your consideration (if you wish).

### 39. What happens if I go to a connect group, then stop, and then want to come back?

- Connect groups should be warm and inviting. The environment is not designed to make you feel pressured or uncomfortable. Therefore, reconnecting should be simple and straightforward—just start going to the group again. If you wish to visit other groups you may. You may want to reconnect by attending a Discover GLCC class as well.

## **Volunteer to Serve FAQs:**

### 40. How do I use my spiritual gifts to help the needs of the church?

- The first step is to know what your spiritual gifts are. If you don't know what your spiritual gifts are, you may want to take a spiritual gifts inventory (can be found online) or by attending a Discover GLCC class. As God leads, you may want to review the various ministry needs within the church and determine where the best fit is for you to serve. You may consider talking to someone who is volunteering in a similar position and/or discuss your interest with the ministry leader. *Most importantly, prayerfully consider where God may be leading you to serve.* You may find that God is calling you to serve in a capacity

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where you have no experience or feel you have no spiritual gift and that is okay. Take God's lead on this and feel free to talk to your Connect Group Leader, Deacon, or the Pastors.

### 41. Do I have to be a member to volunteer to serve?

- To serve as a leader in the church (i.e. connect group leader, deacon, children's lead teachers, youth leaders, various church committees) you must be a member or progressing towards membership.
- Anyone desiring to serve in the Children's Ministry will be asked to complete a Volunteer Information Sheet and provide permission to obtain a background check. See below for more information on the background check. The information gathered will be reviewed and we will check references to ensure the safety of the children and GLCC.
- To serve in a lead teaching position within the children's ministry, individuals must be regularly involved with GLCC for 6 months prior to their application and a member of the church (or are actively pursuing membership). This is so the church leadership team can have enough time to assess whether the individual has the gifts and character traits that will enable him or her to safely and effectively work with our children.
- Volunteers may also serve as assistants to a lead teacher. This position does not require membership (but it does require a background check, see below). Jr. and Sr. high youth (grades 6<sup>th</sup> through 12<sup>th</sup>) may serve in the children's ministries under the direct supervision of a leader. Our 5<sup>th</sup> grade students may occasionally serve in the pre-school or kindergarten classes.
- Volunteering in any other capacity (outside of leadership) does not require you to be a member.

### 42. What are the volunteer commitments for each volunteer position? Who coordinates volunteer openings?

- Volunteer commitments vary. Your commitment can be as little as once a month, once a week, or on a monthly or weekly rotation for regularly occurring activities. You may also volunteer for special events. Volunteer coordination is typically the role of the ministry leader or leadership team. Please refer to the list of contacts for the ministry which you are interested in serving. Some of the ministry programs also have brochures that list information for those interested in serving. These brochures and contact names are available on the Information Board in the church lobby.

### 43. What volunteer positions require a background check and why? What gets checked?

- Background checks are required on all of our Children's Ministry volunteers (this includes leaders, as well as volunteers). The information obtained from a background check may include driving history (including traffic citations), a social security number verification, present and former addresses, criminal and civil history/records, and the state sex offender records. You are entitled to a complete copy of any background information report of

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which you are the subject by requesting a copy from GLCC. Background checks are required to ensure the safety of our children, as well as to comply with our insurance policy.

### 44. How do I sign up to volunteer to serve?

- You may contact the ministry director or leader via phone or email; you may complete a Volunteer Interest/Information Sheet and drop it in the offering box; or you may talk to another volunteer who can direct you to the right person.

### **Program/Ministry FAQs:**

### 45. How do I find out what enrichment and/or support programs are available to me, my children, and/or my family?

- Attend a Discover GLCC class; check out the “Resources” link, Features, and Upcoming Events calendar on the website ([www.gracelifecc.org](http://www.gracelifecc.org)); sign up to receive the GLCC Midweek eNewsletter; check out the ministry tables around the outer hallways; catch the announcements before and after worship service; check out the wall in the lobby by the church office; talk to a greeter/usher; talk to the person at the Connect Group table in the GLCC Café; ask a Connect Group leader; talk to or send an email to a ministry leader; or call the church.

### 46. What is available for the children on Sunday mornings?

- Our nursery is open for children 0 to 24 months during both services.
- At 9:30am, we have Sunday school for preschool (2-5 years old) through 5<sup>th</sup> grade, as well as Nursery.
- At 11:00 am, we have Preschool Junior Church (2-5 years old), Little Junior Church (Kindergarten & 1<sup>st</sup> grade) and Junior Church (2<sup>nd</sup> - 5<sup>th</sup> grade), as well as nursery.
- Parents and children are greeted at each of the check-in stations and assisted with sign-in and placement of a preschool label or an elementary color coded security band on each child (with the exception of 5<sup>th</sup> graders).
- Children that participate in both Sunday school and Junior Church are escorted to Junior Church classrooms by our teachers.
- Our Promotion Sunday is the 2<sup>nd</sup> Sunday of September.

### 47. What do junior high youth do on Sunday mornings (6th – 8th grade)?

- Junior high youth who arrive at 9:30am attend the worship service in the auditorium. After the 9:30am service, Sunday School is offered; please stop by the Welcome Desk (in the lobby) for current room assignments.

## FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS(FAQs)

### 48. What do senior high youth do on Sunday mornings (9th- 12th grade)?

- High school youth who arrive at 9:30am attend the worship service in the auditorium. After the 9:30am service, Sunday School is offered; please stop by the Welcome Desk (in the lobby) for current room assignments.

### 49. Do you offer youth group?

- Yes, “Heartbeat- GLCC Youth Worship” meets on Sunday nights at 5:30pm during the academic school year. This is designed to provide a weekly youth worship experience followed by a time of fellowship. The various Sunday school classes often organize off-site activities for informal fellowship, service and Bible study. “Hangin’ with Pastor Paul” is a special time of community for senior high teens that meets Wednesday evenings from 7-8:30pm in Todd’s Place.

### 50. How do I find out what weekly events, monthly events, or yearly events occur at church?

- Activities are typically listed in the weekly church bulletin, eNewsletter and on the GLCC website calendar. This information is also in the Discover GLCC packet.

### 51. How does the electronic Prayer Request work and who receives the “Prayer Chain”?

- Grace Life Community Church believes in the power of prayer. We have organized an email prayer chain group on Facebook where people involved with our church can post prayer concerns, praises and updates. This technology provides a supportive, online community. If you would like to join us on Facebook, please request to join through Facebook.
- For those who don't have Facebook you may submit your prayer requests by email to us at [prayer@gracelifecc.org](mailto:prayer@gracelifecc.org). You can also request to be added to our email prayer chain which provides email updates 2-3 times a week. These updates will be copied directly from the Facebook page.

### 52. How are missionaries supported?

- Missionaries are supported out of the general fund of the church through the regular giving of God’s people. We support 25 missionaries/organizations worldwide, including a crisis pregnancy center and a prison ministry. The church is active with short term mission trips, sending teams to Brazil, England, Honduras, Indonesia, Italy, Jamaica, plus other countries.

### 53. When do missionaries visit?

- As schedules permit, missionaries present their work during a Sunday morning service while they are on furlough.

## FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS(FAQs)

### 54. How are missionaries appointed?

- Missionaries and ministries that agree with the vision and philosophy of the church are nominated by the mission committee, reviewed by the deacon board and approved by the congregation at the quarterly church business meetings.

### 55. What countries is the ministry of GLCC currently affecting?

- GLCC missions is currently involved in Australia, Brazil, England, Germany, India, Indonesia, Italy, Jamaica, Morocco, Senegal, South Africa, Sweden, Thailand, United States, Togo, and Zambia.

## Communication FAQs

### 56. What is “Connect Point”?

- ConnectPoint is the GLCC Online Community. This site is designed to help you get and stay connected with the ministries of GLCC. On the site you can keep your profile up to date, select communication preferences, send and receive email to your small group, find out about upcoming events, make online contributions, sign up for classes, and much more! Some might say that it's like Facebook for church! We hope you enjoy using ConnectPoint GLCC. You can access it by going to [www.gracelifecc.org](http://www.gracelifecc.org) , then clicking on “Resources” and then clicking “connectpoint”.

### 57. How important is it that I update my profile on ConnectPoint?

- It is very important that you update your profile on ConnectPoint. We use the information in ConnectPoint to create the church directory, contact our members and non-members, and help foster community.

### 58. What is the benefit of registering on the website?

- Anyone can register for ConnectPoint (members and non-members). Once you register, you can set-up and tailor your communication settings to suit your personal preferences. When you register on the website (click on ‘Resources’, then click on ‘connectpoint’, you will be able to “opt-in” to specific email communications such as the GLCC Midweek eNewsletter, Prayer Chain, Kidz Korner, VBS, Men's Ministry, GLCC Global Outreach, Soul Restoration, Youth Ministries, and Women's Ministry. You can also RSVP for events, give online, and set-up a profile.

### 59. Is there a calendar with every event on it?
