## WELCOME

They said to all the people of Israel, "the land we traveled through and explored is a wonderful land! And if the Lord is pleased with us, He will bring us safely into that land and give it to us. It is rich land flowing with milk and honey. Do not rebel against the Lord, and don't be afraid of the people of the land."

#### God's Faithfulness

Faith matters to God. This is the dominant theme in the book of Numbers and the key to its theology. Linked with the books of Exodus and Leviticus, Numbers demonstrates the nature of faith by contrasting God's faithfulness in fulfilling the promises made to Abraham with the faithlessness of Abraham's descendants.

God had promised to give the land of Canaan to Abraham's descendants, and also promised that they would take possession of the cities of their enemies. Yet just as God's people were poised to see how God is faithful, something went horribly wrong. On the threshold of the Promised Land, Israel questioned their ability to overcome their enemies and take possession of the land.

This lack of faith proved to be costly; the generation that followed Moses into the wilderness died there because they failed to take God at His word. In discussing this incident, the apostle Paul recounts Israel's sins: idolatry, immorality, doubt, and ungratefulness (1 Cor. 10:1-11). This experience served as both an example and a warning to the church. On the one hand, it was meant to teach us humility. Israel's weakness is matched by our own. More important, it was intended to show us that our weakness is countered by God's strength. Paul summarizes the lesson to be learned from Israel's failure with this bold conclusion: "God is faithful".

Our faith is grounded in the faithfulness of God. He deserves our trust because He is true to His word. Israel's experiences in the wilderness are a sobering reminder that this kind of faith does not come naturally. It is a gift of grace and it is strengthened by experience. Because God is faithful, we can have faith in Him. As I think back over the history of Grace, I can see God's hand and see God's faithfulness. It is with that confidence from our experience, fueled by God's promises that we boldly move forward in faith.

## GRACE UPDATE

I don't know about you but I feel it is amazing that we have been in our new home, here at Cross View Way, for five years. Time sure does move quickly! I am also amazed at what God has done during this time in the history of Grace.

I am reminded of the Israelites who were eagerly looking forward to inhabiting the land God had promised them. They had waited a long time for that blessing that was promised. In many ways Grace has had that same story in our life as a congregation. We too had land we felt God calling us to, and even though we had to be patient to enter our so called promised land, God blessed us in his timing and now we have been here for five years. It has truly been a land flowing with milk and honey but not without its challenges.

Yet through these challenges we have been able to see God work and receive his blessings. In a world and community that is changing

at a rate faster than ever, Grace stands tall in the community of Menomonee Falls. While other congregations are struggling with declining attendance, low school enrollment, and slowed generosity and giving, Grace is thriving.

Last year we talked about our challenges in reaching the culture around us. We have strived to have the correct ministry in place to minister to the changing dynamics in our culture and the new perspectives our future church family will possess.

I believe that the results of

our measures over this last year speak to the success of our ministry and the changes we have made. God is truly blessing us with new, deeper and greater relationships in our church and in our community.

First and foremost we have to acknowledge the amazing efforts by the body of Christ here at Grace again this year. During 2015 we touched almost 5,000 people's lives in many different contexts and communities. This is an amazing number of people to connect with and potentially have an eternal difference. Yet as I stated last year I believe God is calling us to have an even greater impact in our communities, especially in Milwaukee and right here in Menomonee Falls.

We welcomed 3,167 guests into worship at Grace last year. That represents an increase of 8.7% over an increase last year of 9.6%. This makes it clear that we are being noticed in our community and drawing people to our house of worship. This means

that on any given weekend we have many visitors and thus need to be a welcoming and open family. Even with this increase our worship attendance has remained flat. As we have mentioned in the past people are attending worship less often. In fact, on average, a disciple at Grace attends worship 1.3 times a month. This is one of the most alarmina and concerning measures we see. This is not a trend happening only at Grace, it is happening across America. To that end we are suggesting that all disciples connected to Grace add one weekend a month to their current worship pattern. It is important in this ever changing and fast paced world that we are equipped on a more regular basis with the word of God and strengthened through His sacrament of the Lord's Supper. It is very difficult for us to be united in mission and purpose if we only come together a little over once a month. This also diminishes our growth as disciples.

As good as these traditional statistical measures are, our ministry impact is far more important to the kingdom of God. 2015 was a good year in terms of our impact in the kingdom of God. We welcomed 36 new families into membership with a combined total of 83 people, and increase of 4.2% over 2014. We also welcomed 110 individuals into God's family here at Grace. This was highlighted by 46 baptisms and 3 adult baptisms. Our children's and youth ministry went through some changes this last year and this created strong impact as well. Our JAM attendance averages 76 students while our Jr./Sr. Youth attendance averaged 75 students. One key highlight in our children's ministry was our VBS for the summer. Total attendance for VBS was 243

children. Grace is truly a place that feels like home to more and more children.

In addition to this great story of God's blessing in our youth and children's ministry, God is blessing us in our day school. Two years ago we entered into the choice program in an effort to allow families access to the blessings of our day school. This was met with mixed reaction but it has been a blessing for Grace and our school. For the '15-'16 school year we had an enrollment of 209 students. This year we have the largest enrollment in over 10 years with 252 children enrolled in our school. We are also more diverse and actively reflecting our community.

I hope you see the blessing God is providing to us; He is keeping His promises. Our worship is vibrant, our ministry is strong and our reach is extending further and further. We are in the land of milk and honey. Yet just like the Israelites we do have some challenges, but unlike them we need to have confidence and trust in God to continue to provide and lead us forward

Our areas of challenge and opportunity continue to be in the

area of generosity and giving. We have been blessed with some very generous people here at Grace and I want to say thank you for your support of God's mission and ministry. If you remember, last year we made the decision to depart from our past capital campaign structure. This was a very large leap of faith. I am pleased to report that the people of Grace have largely responded well. Our total giving is actually down only 3.4% or \$52,233. Even with this shortfall, through cuts in our budget, we were able to finish the year in a strong financial position, as reported in our financial highlights on the following pages. Yet, with our increased connection to people in our community our contribution per attendee decreased 3.6% despite an increase to 775 giving units. We are thankful for this increase, however this leaves a portion of our family here at Grace who are not contributing or living a generous life towards God's ministry. This greatly affects our ability to impact more lives in our communities. God is calling us to much greater impact and that will require great faith, trust and generosity.



### **Frequency of Worship**







### OUR COMMITMENT TO FINANCIAL STABILITY

The question "How are we doing?" is frequently asked during the year. This is not always an easy question to answer given the growing complexity of our organization. As the rapid changes to our social and economic structures have shown, nothing remains the same and we must learn to adapt to this changing environment or risk falling behind. It is with this in mind that we continue to focus on not only our short term financial stability but to ensure that our long term plans will continue to work towards a financially stable future. Through all of this we are certain of one thing: God is in control of our Church and our School. It is He who challenges us to grow his Kingdom and to serve those around us. The 2015/2016 fiscal year was one of challenges as


we moved from our 3 year campaign model to fund our weekly Bond payments to a single annual giving goal that would cover our general operations and debt payments. In addition, we experienced a shortfall in anticipated school and church income which meant that we needed to make a number of adjustments to our expenditures throughout the vear to ensure that expenses did not exceed income. Although we successfully ended the year with our budget balanced, our overall financial situation shows a loss which is mostly attributable to funds spent from our existing restricted funds in comparison to last year. Although our operating budget is tightly monitored we need to be aware of the impact of our aging


Kenwood campus which is in constant need of repair and upgrades. In addition, the pending sale of the additional 40 unused acres at our Hwy Q campus, when closed, will result in a significant reduction in our bond debt, thus lowering our weekly payments. This event will significantly aid in improving our financial results in the future. Our annual audit and our Financial Information Report for the Department of Public Instruction were once again completed by Winter, Kloman, Motor and Repp, and the Financial Highlights are shown on the opposite page.





#### MISSION

A mission statement offers insight into what church leaders view as the primary purpose for being in business. To that end bellow is our mission statement here at Grace. We hope that it helps each one of us in fulfilling our calling here at Grace.

#### Our mission is to invite ordinary people into a sacramental life.

(We accomplish this through loving God, loving others and making disciples.)

### EXTRAORDINARY NORMS OF GRACE


But most of these gifts are internal and self focused. They make a better home for us here at Grace. This
