Things you may have wanted to know but didn't know how to ask

Pastors aspire to a noble vocation

1 Timothy 3:1

Here is a trustworthy saying: Whoever aspires to be an overseer desires a noble task.

In the popular movie Shrek, the donkey struts about proudly when the princess calls him "a noble steed". Even though he was a donkey, acted like a donkey, looked like a donkey and couldn't be anything else other than a donkey, being called "a noble steed" was a source of pride. That was because the comparison elevated him in the eyes of those around him.

The Apostle Paul, in speaking with his young friend Timothy, begins a series of verses about the public pastoral ministry with the verse quoted above. He calls it "a noble task". Notice, he first qualifies that one should aspire to it. In other words, it isn't handed out like free popcorn at the local auto dealership. One should desire to do it, not be pushed into doing it. And why is that?

Public pastoral ministry isn't for the faint of heart. It is said that pastors are on duty 24/7, 365 days a year – and that isn't far from the truth. They are available to the members of their congregation at any time. They schedule time to get to know the community they live in, so they can be better prepared to give an answer for the hope they have. They schedule time to sit in front of members to teach them, individuals to counsel them and unbelievers to instruct them while still taking the time to pray for each and every one of them. They do this while still being husbands and fathers, coaches and cleaners (since they want to help their wives clean the house!) and are even known to develop a few hobbies along the way of life.

Even though the public pastoral ministry may seem to be more than one man can handle, every pastor knows that he isn't doing this work alone. He walks with Christ, who is the great shepherd of the sheep and has called him to be an under-shepherd to a particular flock. He studies Christ's word daily, to be better prepared with that same Word to share God's Law and God's Gospel in season and out of season. In fact, the pastor who intends on participating in this noble task and feels that he can do it all by himself, takes the nobility out of the task and makes the public pastoral ministry all about himself and not about Christ.

So, the next time you see your pastor at church, ask him to call on you at home, meet him at the local grocery stores with a list in his hand, or look at the noble task he has as an overseer, a pastor. Then, give thanks to God that he is here, serving Christ by serving you with the Word and the Sacraments of Baptism and the Lord's Supper. He is not a donkey – he is a noble steed, because he trusts in the Lord, not in himself.
