The Store will be closed Monday

The Deli will be closed Monday and open Tuesday thru Friday 11 AM until 2 PM. The Deli will also be open Tuesday evening from 5 PM until 7 PM. This will allow those who are not able to come to the Deli during their lunch hour to enjoy a healthy evening meal with their family.

On Monday or Thursday evenings the plan is to offer cooking classes and seminars to provide the community with as much good information on health as possible. Monica is a licensed Healing Massage Therapist and is licensed to perform hydrotherapy. A

new Counseling Room will offer privacy to her clients.
