Tom's Note...

C.S. Lewis invited us to picture our life as a house. We know we need some obvious repairs – fixing broken plumbing, repairing the leaking roof, replacing bad carpet. But then God begins making bigger changes that we don't quite understand, some of which are downright painful. God starts knocking out a wall here and putting up a tower there. The Spirit opens our lives to new relationships and possibilities that we never imagined. Lewis wrote: "You thought you were going to be made into a decent little cottage; but He is building a palace. He intends to come and live in it Himself." (*Mere Christianity* p.176)

Jim Harnish writes that: "Though the changes may be uncomfortable (*and in some cases unwanted*) if our goal is to be made perfect in love, if our lives are centering in loving God and loving others, and if the contractors in charge of the renovations are none other than the Spirit of God and the Risen Jesus, then we know that the changes are for our good and for God's glory. We can dare to believe these changes are custom-designed to bring out the best within us and equip us to be the ambassadors of God's love in this world." (*A Disciple's Heart* p. 39)

My brain may tell me that my only hope for reaching my full potential is to allow God's Spirit to clean out the trash, tear down the walls I've built to protect myself, and rebuild my life into the likeness of Jesus until my heart is defined by the height, depth, length, and width of the love of God. My brain may acknowledge that message - but that doesn't make the changes any less easy to handle.

This month we are walking through the Book of Ephesians. While it is a book filled with great and exciting promises from God, the writer doesn't back away from the fact that all must undergo some level of inner renovation if we hope to embrace those promises. C.S. Lewis writes that if our goal is to experience healthy, positive, and faithful growth in the coming year, there are 3 things each of us must do every day. (1) Recognize our need for God to begin a transforming work in us. (2) Invite the Holy Spirit to enter our lives and do the work that only the Spirit can do. (3) Relinquish control so the Spirit can build a house more grand than we could ever imagine. As we continue our journey through Ephesians, these are the things my brain will keep telling my heart as we move towards the perfect life in Christ Jesus – in the anticipated hope that at the end of the journey, my heart will tell my brain: "You were right. The changes weren't easy, but it was worth it. Look at the house God has built."

Yokefellow Prison Ministry

Did you know that when inmates are released from North Carolina prisons and re-enter society, no ministries are available to support them as ex-offenders? Ironically, while inmates are incarcerated, they receive emotional and spiritual support from various prison ministries, but that support vanishes during the vulnerable period of re-entering society. This lack of support increases the odds of recidivism. **Yokefellow Prison Ministry of N.C., Inc.** would like to change this.

Yokefellow is an interdenominational and interracial Christian "prison 'listening ministry'" serving the inmates in 2/3 N.C. prisons. Yokefellow is developing a pilot to expand its listening ministry to ex-offenders in Guilford County and has invited GCUMC to partner in this endeavor by providing 3-5 volunteers with a heart for ex-offenders. 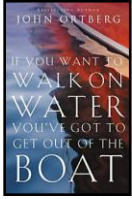

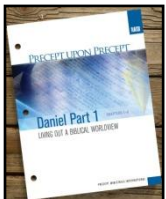
