Note from Matt.....

This weekend was a great time to celebrate the sense of community and connection at the church. From Fall Fest to the Brunswick Stew to the Goodwill Truck to the CROPWalk, so many people were serving together in order to raise funds for vital mission and ministry. From stirring pots to selling pumpkins to loading donations in the back of the trailer, there was a sense that everyone had an important role to play.

I have also been fortunate to spend some time lately visiting with the pastors and lay people from other local United Methodist Churches. Nancy Rankin, our District Superintendent, has linked us with ten other churches in what's known as a Missional Network. We will be sharing in some ministries with these other churches in the weeks and months ahead that will allow us to have a greater impact than we would have had alone. When we are united in exciting ways with others in this church and beyond, it's easy to believe what Dr. King said: "We are tied together in the single garment of destiny, caught in an inescapable network of mutuality."
