"I am the Lord; I change not!" (Malachai 3: 6a)



- ...children serving each other.



MUNCH—BackPack Meals Program

This year we averaged close to 90 backpacks sent home each weekend with an elementary or middle school youth.

This summer, the program will be run out of Faith Harbor UMC. The food stored at the Topsail Middle School storage facility will be moved to FHUMC. We currently have 57 recipients signed up for weekend deliveries each week.

The need for food items and monetary donations are always welcomed! If you are wondering what items are needed, please consider the following items as our regular staples:

- Cheerios, Oatmeal, or other low sugar cereals
- Canned or plastic jar Pasta Sauce and dry Pasta (we can't send glass containers home)
- Canned Vegetables & Fruits, Individual Fruit Containers (low sugar/no refrigeration)
- Plastic Jars of Peanut Butter and Jelly
- Individual Packages of Peanut Butter Crackers, Cheese Crackers, Snack bars, etc.
- Canned Meats (ham, tuna, chicken, meat spread)
- Chicken and Tuna Helper (we combine these with the appropriate canned meat)
- Hearty/Chunky Soups & Stews, Macaroni & Cheese
- Canned Pastas (Spaghetti-O's, Ravioli-O's, etc.)
- 100% Fruit Juice (Cans or plastic bottles)
- Monetary donations are always welcome. Checks made out to HUMC with "MUNCH" in the memo field works!

"Reduced Sugar" and "Lower Sodium" are best! Please, NO glass containers. Thanks for your support!





