Dear friends,

During the season of Lent, when we are on a journey both spiritually and time wise, I tend to do some extra devotions – and often around the Old Testament. The day I am writing this the reading was from the Book of Ruth. Specifically it was this text (1:6-18)

Then she started to return with her daughters-in-law from the country of Moah, for she had heard in the country of Moah that the Lord had considered his people and given them food. So she set out from the place where she had been living, she and her two daughters-in-law, and they went on their way to go back to the land of Judah. But Naomi said to her two daughters-in-law, "Go back each of you to your mother's house. May the Lord deal kindly with you, as you have dealt with the dead and with me. The Lord

grant that you may find security, each of you in the house of your husband." Then she kissed them, and they wept aloud. They said to her, 'No, we will return with you to your people." But Naomi said, "Turn back, my daughters, why will you go with me? Do I still have sons in my womb that they may become your husbands? Turn back, my daughters, go your way, for I am too old to have a husband. Even if I thought there was hope for me, even if I should have a husband tonight and bear sons, would you then wait until they were grown? Would you then refrain from marrying? No, my daughters, it has been far more bitter for me than for you, because the hand of the Lord has turned against me." Then they wept aloud again. Orpah kissed her mother-in-law, but Ruth clung to her. So she said, "See, your sister-in-law has gone back to her people and to her gods; return after your sister-in-law." But Ruth said, "Do not press me to leave you or to turn back from following you! Where you go, I will go; Where you lodge, I will lodge; your people shall be my people, and your God my God. Where you die, I will die— there will I be buried. May the Lord do thus and so to me, and more as well, if even death parts me from you!" When Naomi saw that she was determined to go with her, she said no more to her.

The words that jumped at me was from verse 12: "Turn back,...go your way,...." A short devotional on those words may be something like this:

I may well be in the minority, but I like Mondays. One of the reasons I like Mondays is the fact that it is the beginning of something new. A new week! Monday is a day to get caught up with others about what happened over the weekend.

Mondays is the beginning of something that I don't know what is to come. Much like the road ahead for Naomi and her two daughter-in-laws. For some people the facing of the unknown creates great fears and apprehension. For others, like myself, it is the challenge we need to get the motor going again. We are much like Naomi's daughters-in-law. We can look back or look forward in our journey in faith and life.

But more than all that, Mondays are a day to look for a sign of what is to come in the week ahead. A time to look for an opportunity to witness to the Gospel. Or a time to look to see how God may touch us in the days ahead. This is the glory and the thrill that makes me take a great liking to Mondays. How about you?

Lord of the future, how will you show yourself in my life this coming week? How will you allow me to be your witness this coming week? Please tell me. Amen.

is Thursday, May 5, at Laurel Manor, 39000 Schoolcraft Rd., Livonia. This year's theme is "Living Generously," and will feature Brad Hewitt of Thrivent Financial and the Russ Taff, contemporary Christian recording artist.

**Brad Hewitt** is a CEO with a unique perspective. Since 2010, Brad has served as president and CEO of Thrivent Financial, a not-for-profit Fortune 500 organization. In this role, he has made it his work to help Americans rediscover a healthy relationship with money. The idea that being wise with money, and generosity, go hand in hand lies at the heart of this relationship.

Contemporary Christian recording artist, **Russ Taff**, will provide the special music for the breakfast. Russ first gained recognition as lead vocalist for The Imperials (1977–81). One of his best-known performances is the song "Praise The Lord". He has also been a member of the Gaither Vocal Band, and occasionally tours with Bill Gaither in the Gaither Homecoming concerts. As a solo artist and songwriter, Taff is known for the 1980s anthem "We Will Stand".

Our prayer list has been undergoing a transformation. With direction from Pastor Krister, we are attempting to create a more manageable and user-friendly list.


Beginning in April, you will see the following changes:
